1. R-CRA-2023-42 - A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving The Minutes Of The Regular CRA Meeting Of June 7, 2023.

<u>ACTION</u>: Motion was made by Board member Quintana to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Biederman and on voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

2. R-CRA-2023-43 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving The Minutes Of The Regular CRA Meeting Of July 5, 2023.

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Quintana to adopt the resolution as revised. The motion was seconded by Board member Biederman and on voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

3. R-CRA-2023-44 - A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving And Authorizing The Appropriate CRA Officials To Execute An Agreement With Ocean Rescue Alliance, Inc. To Provide Design, Construction And Deployment Services For Artificial Reefs In An Amount Up To \$583,560.

Jorge Camejo introduced Shelby Thomas, Ocean Rescue Alliance to provide a presentation to the Board. The Board requested additional information from Dr. Michael Jenkins. Questions and concerns were addressed by staff and the consultants. Shelby Thomas presented three options of for the Board's discussion. The Board unanimously agreed to approve the resolution with the amendment that Option 1 will include the condition that Ocean Alliance Rescue work with the County and CRA regarding out planted level of nearshore coral to demonstrate what the habitat could be.

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Shuham to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Callari and on voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

4. R-CRA-2023-45 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida, Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Authorizing The Appropriate CRA Officials To Execute A Change Order With Florida Power And Light Company ("FPL") For The Design Of Phase IV-East/West Streets And SR A1A Undergrounding Of Overhead Utilities Conversion, Increasing The Approved Contract From \$1,019,932.00 to \$1,808,613.00, In Accordance With Section 38.48 Of The Procurement Code (Change Order).

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Quintana to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Biederman and on a voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

5. R-CRA-2023-46 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida, Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving And Authorizing The Appropriate CRA Officials To Execute An Interlocal Agreement With The City Of Hollywood for Reimbursement Of Costs For Funding The Design, Bidding Services Relating To Stormwater Pump Station Serving The State Road A1A Between Iris Terrace And Daffodil Terrace In An Amount Up To \$421,195.78.

Jorge Camejo introduced James Poole, District Drainage Engineer for the Florida Department of Transportation, who provided a presentation to the Board. An extensive discussion ensued among member of the Board and staff. Chair Levy presented photos of the king tide flooding along Hollywood Beach on October 3rd, 2023.

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Shuham to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Quintana and on a voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

6. R-CRA-2023-47 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida, Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Authorizing The Appropriate CRA Officials To Negotiate An Agreement With The Highest Ranked Firm, Basulto Management Consulting, Inc., To Provide Construction Oversight And Project Control Services For Phase IV — Undergrounding Of Overhead Utilities And Streetscape Beautification

(BCRA 19-001) In Accordance With Section 38.43 Of The Procurement Code. (Formal Solicitation Procedure)

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Callari to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Shuham and on a voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

7. R-CRA-2023-48 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida, Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving And Authorizing The Appropriate CRA Officials To Execute A Property Improvement Program Grant Agreement With Easy Restaurant Group, LLC For On-site Improvements To The Property Located At 1925 Hollywood Blvd In A Total Grant Amount Not To Exceed \$75,000.00.

Jorge Camejo introduced Christopher Crocitto, Project Manager, who provided a presentation to the Board.

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Shuham to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Board member Anderson and on a voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.

8. R-CRA-2023-49 — A Resolution Of The Hollywood, Florida Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA"), Approving And Authorizing An Advertising Media Plan And Authorizing The Expenditure Of Funds In An Amount Up To \$380,000.00 In Accordance With Section 38.41 (C)(11)(C) Of The Procurement Code. (Advertising Media).

Jorge Camejo introduced Lyliana Cardinale, Marketing and Media Coordinator, who provided a presentation to the Board.

Board member Biederman made a motion to revise the media plan to exclude Hollywood Hills and Hollywood Lakes publications. The motion failed for the lack of a second. He further suggested that expenditure to Pandora (\$50,000) be eliminated, and those funds be split evenly between Facebook and Instagram.

ACTION: Motion was made by Board member Shuham to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Vice-chair Gruber and on a voice vote passed unanimously 7-0.
