A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO APPLY FOR AND, IF AWARDED, ACCEPT FUNDING FROM THE BROWARD COUNTY TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FUND TO IMPLEMENT VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS; AND AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL APPLICABLE PROGRAM DOCUMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE BROWARD COUNTY 2022 TRANSPORTATION SURTAX FUND APPLICATIONS.

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2018, the voters of Broward County approved the Transportation Surtax ballot measure; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2019, the Broward County Board of Commissioners approved the First Amendment to the Transportation Surtax Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on February 17, 2021, the City Commission passed and adopted Resolution No. R- 2021-034 authorizing the appropriate City officials to execute the Second Amendment of the Transportation System Surtax Interlocal Agreement among Broward County, the Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization and various municipalities to address the surtax process and restate various surtax cycles, allocations, etc.; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2022, Broward County Mobility Advancement Program (“MAP”) finalized the evaluation criteria and opened an application portal for 2022 Surtax Capital Improvement Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Development Services, Engineering, Transportation and Mobility Division has identified the following Surtax capital improvement projects for possible 2022 Surtax funding that will improve the level of service for vehicular traffic, bicyclists, and pedestrians within the City:

- (1) The Hollywood Boulevard Traffic Calming Project consists of narrowing the through lanes on Hollywood Boulevard at City Hall Circle and the geometric realignment of two intersections to reduce traffic speeds in the area and improve bicycle/pedestrian safety.
- (2) The N46th Avenue Traffic Capacity Improvement Project consists of widening the pavement at three key intersections to improve vehicular capacity and improved street and pedestrian lighting, signage and pavement markings, drainage improvements, bike lanes, milling and resurfacing, ADA, and sidewalk

improvements between Stirling Road and Hollywood Boulevard to improve overall corridor safety.

- (3) The North 29th Avenue Road Diet Project will involve the repurposing one travel lane in each direction between Sheridan Street and Stirling Road to slow traffic. The design will also include exclusive left turn lanes at median openings and undergrounding of FPL power poles to reduce the potential for crashes. The project will also include improved street and pedestrian lighting, signage and pavement markings, drainage improvements, bike lanes, milling and resurfacing, ADA, and sidewalk improvements
- (4) The Taft Street Traffic Capacity Improvement Project consists of the widening of pavement at seven key intersections on Taft Street between North 40th Avenue and North 22nd Avenue to improve vehicular capacity as well as improved street and pedestrian lighting, signage and pavement markings, drainage improvements, bike lanes, milling and resurfacing, and ADA and sidewalk improvements to improve overall corridor safety.
- (5) The Tyler Street Traffic Calming Project will convert Tyler Street from a one-way westbound traffic to two-way eastbound/westbound traffic with bicycle sharrows which will improve traffic flow within the downtown core and result in traffic calming improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing 'WHEREAS' clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

Section 2: That it approves and authorizes the appropriate City officials to apply for Broward County 2022 Transportation Surtax Funding to implement the aforementioned Capital Improvement Projects.

Section 3: That the City Manager is authorized to accept such funding, if awarded, provided; however, the City Manager has the discretion to refuse the funding in those circumstances where he determines it is in the best interest of the City to do so, in which case he shall advise the City Commission of his intention to refuse the funding.

Section 4: That upon funding from The Broward County Transportation Surtax Fund being awarded to the City, and the City Manager accepting the award, the appropriate City officials are authorized to execute any and all agreements and any other applicable documents in a form acceptable to the City Manager and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney.

Section 5: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
