3) Education (Arts School, ArtsPark at Young Circle, Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center).

- Summer Arts Camp (June-August 2015): Up to 19 sessions, 1-4 weeks long, in the visual/performing arts for ages 4-18; includes two stage performances by Broadway Actors campers ages 8-17; 10 gallery and theater presentations by Young Artists, Young Actors campers (ages 6-12); two gallery and theater presentations by Littlest Artists, Little Actors (ages 4-5); two exhibitions by Young Artists Advanced (ages 10-15), and Hip Musicians Percussion Groove (ages 10-15).

- Visual arts workshops and classes for youth and adults, including ARTastic Collaborations (Oct. 2013 to May 2014).
- School field trips: ACCH is one of 12 organizations approved for school field trips by Broward County Public Schools.
- Private voice, piano, flute and guitar lessons, ongoing.

4) Family Performance Series: Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center. Targeted to youth ages 2-12. Each show includes an interactive component involving children and the artists.
