



**Art and Culture Center/Hollywood
Cultural Arts Programming
Scope of Services**

Programming activities during the 2021-22 funding period include:

1) Gallery Exhibitions, 1650 Harrison Street

Admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors; members free. Free gallery admission is offered on the third Sunday of each month as part of Free Arts! Family Days art-making activities. The schedule is confirmed as follows (additional shows are being scheduled at this time in galleries 2 and 3):

- Oct. 16, 2021 to Feb. 27, 2022 – *Introspective: A Reckoning of the Soul*, multi-media group exhibition and additional outreach programming based on the themes of social justice and Black identity. Guest curator Marie Vickles. Also, *T. Elliott Mansa: On Memory and the Radical Black Imagination* Gallery 2); Chire Regans (aka VantaBlack) solo exhibition (Gallery 3).
- March 12 to May 15, 2022 – *C(h)oral Stories and Collective Actions*, group exhibition in collaboration with guest curator Ombretta Agró Andruff that utilizes various visual media to illustrate the impact of climate change and man-made pollution on coral reefs.
- June 4 to August 14, 2022 – *Books as Art*, family-friendly group show that incorporates bookmaking and self-published zines into painting, illustration, sculpture and multi-media works.
- June 4 to Sept. 23, 2022 – Solo exhibition TBD by a resident artist at Oolite Arts in Miami-Dade. Gallery 2
- Aug. 26 to Sept. 23, 2022 – *Exposed: Annual Exhibition and Fund-raiser*, more than 70 works by artists invited by the Curator to participate. Culminates with a live, closing-night drawing in which every ticket holder goes home with an original artwork from the exhibition. Gallery 3: TBD

STEAM-Themed Free Arts! Family Days is provided from noon-4 p.m. on the third Sunday of every month. In addition to free admission to the galleries, families take part in art-making activities that integrate the creativity of the arts to linear thinking common to STEM subjects – Science, Technology, Engineering, Math.

2) Open Dialogues documentary films produced by the Center

Production and screenings of upcoming 2021 film *Black Voices / Black Stories* featuring on-camera interviews of individuals in Broward's Black community; and public and virtual screenings with moderated talks of the 2020 film *Stories From the LGBTQ Community*, which captures the coming-out narratives of seven Broward residents.

3) Education for youth ages 5-18 in the visual/performing arts. Arts School, 1626 Harrison Street; ArtsPark at Young Circle, 1 Young Circle; Hollywood Central

Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), 1770 Monroe Street. Free and fee-based programs open to children and adults, regardless of ability level.

- Arts Aspire: Year-round academic and career development program for ages 14-25. Includes in-person and Zoom-based workshops, mentoring activities, internships, and special event and programming support. Sessions for school-year calendar 2020-21 and Summer 2021.
 - Distance Learning Arts Studio: Live broadcasts during the 2020-21 school calendar in which an ACCH instructor provides theme-based arts instruction via an online teleconferencing network that links directly to early-learning centers and Broward Schools classrooms.
 - Early Voices Collaborative Exhibition: Thematic artworks created by pre-K children and their educators in early-learning centers to coincide with the NAEYC Week of the Young Child. Spring 2021.
 - Summer Arts Camp (June 14–Aug. 12, 2022): Program sessions, 2-to-4 weeks in length, for ages 5-18; includes two theatrical performances by students (ages 8-18) enrolled in Broadway Actors, and gallery and theater presentations by Young Artists, Young Actors campers (ages 8-12) and Littlest Actors/Littlest Artists (ages 5-7).
 - ARTastic Artists: Weekly classes in the visual arts for ages 6-12 (fall and spring).
 - Center Stage Kids: Weekly classes in the performing arts for ages 8-18 (spring)
 - Curious Creators Spring Break Art Camp: Paper-making, basic book-binding, painting, collage, and mural-creating (ages 6-12). March 21-25, 2022
 - Community Gallery: Exhibitions of K-12 students and community entities.
 - Private Lessons: Individual lessons in voice, piano, guitar, ukelele
- 4) **Theatre:** Management of all events at the 500-seat Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center, 1770 Monroe Street, includes Center programming, rentals to outside arts/community organizations, and events presented by Broward County Public Schools and the City of Hollywood.
