The Special City Commission Meeting of the City of Hollywood, Florida, was called to order by Mayor Levy on Wednesday September 18, 2024 at 6:09 PM in the City Commission Room, Room 219, 2600 Hollywood Blvd., Hollywood Florida.

George R. Keller Jr., City Manager, provided an overview of the Proposed FY 2025 Budget.

Adam Reichbach, Assistant City Manager for Finance and Administration, provided a presentation and additional information on the City Proposed Budget.

Jonathan Antista, Director of Budget and Performance Management, provided additional information.

4. [R-2024-316](#) A Resolution Of The City Commission Of The City Of Hollywood, Florida, Fixing The Amount And Rate Of Taxation For The Fiscal Year Commencing October 1, 2024, And Making The Tax Levy For The Year 2024.

Mayor Levy read the title of the Resolution: "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, FIXING THE AMOUNT AND RATE OF TAXATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2024 AND MAKING THE TAX LEVY FOR THE YEAR 2024."

Mayor Levy stated "THE PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE SET BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD ON SEPTEMBER 12, 2024 IS 7.4479 MILLS, WHICH IS ESTIMATED TO GENERATE GENERAL FUND NET REVENUES OF ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO MILLION, ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED AND ONE DOLLARS (\$182,187,501.00). THIS MILLAGE RATE REPRESENTS A 8.76% INCREASE OVER THE ROLLED-BACK RATE OF 6.8482 MILLS."

The Mayor announced the Resolution was advertised in conformance with Florida Statutes and City Codes. The public hearing was opened; there being no one present who wished to speak, the public hearing was declared closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Commissioner Callari, which was seconded by Commissioner Gruber, to adopt the Resolution. On a voice vote the motion passed unanimously. (7-0)

A Resolution Of The City Commission Of The City Of Hollywood, Florida, Making Appropriations For Fiscal Year 2025 Based On The Operating And Capital Budget Estimate Of Revenues And Expenditures For Each Of The City's Operating Funds As Submitted By The City Manager.

Mayor Levy read the title of the Resolution: "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025 BASED ON THE OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET ESTIMATE OF REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR EACH OF THE CITY'S OPERATING FUNDS AS SUBMITTED BY THE CITY MANAGER."
