Grant programs have different closing dates, so it is important to review the closing date posted for each grant program. It is also wise to apply to all grant programs for which the project may be eligible. During implementation, our Team can also review the contract documents to ensure that all necessary processes, language, and documentation are contained within the documentation.



UNDERSTANDING OF THE CITY'S NEEDS: HOLLYWOOD BEACH HEIGHTS

The City of Hollywood needs to replace and construct a new sidewalk network in Hollywood Beach Heights and Hollywood Beach Estates neighborhoods, in accordance with plans and specifications prepared by Kimley Horn and Associates, Inc. The project is funded through the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Local Agency Program (LAP) and will require that the selected contractor comply with all FDOT and Federal contract conditions. At **RJ Behar**, this is our "bread and butter," as we specialized in working with LAP Funded Projects with various cities and towns throughout South Florida. We are also FDOT Certified for Work Type 10.1 – Roadway Construction Engineering Inspection, another requisite for this project.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Our goals and objectives in this project will begin with providing Qualified and Certified Staffing to the project, in a timely manner, and ensuring that the contractor adheres to all LAP Federal Aid Contract Compliance Requirements. We will maintain and update project monthly status reports, record daily activities on predesigned reports with descriptive photographs in addition to ensure an effective Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) and project safety; and oversee and ensure safety and protection at the worksite, minimizing impacts to residents, businesses, and commuters; and we will be proactive with public involvement information, and project coordination, ensuring a seamless integration between the City, the contractor, and all interested stakeholders.

We will provide effective and timely coordination with the utility owners and agencies, ensure ADA compliance, ensure adherence with all contract compliance requirements, quality control/quality assurance program, establish a material certification process at project start, and perform timely and accurate submittal of final estimates and close-out package, ensuring the project is completed on time and within budget.

AWARENESS OF PROJECT ISSUES:

In preparation for this proposal, the **RJ Behar Team** reviewed the Request of Qualifications and scope, reviewed the provided construction plans, conducted site visits, reviewed available web-based information with the objective of obtaining a comprehensive understanding of the proposed scope of work. During this process, our team identified some of the major challenges and observations to be aware of during the construction of this project, such as:

Other issues that will be addressed as soon as possible will be;

- Sidewalk elevation issues that can produce ponding water in the area.
- The plans call for 113 trees to be removed and a large percentage of them are more than 40 ft. tall with 6 ft. trunk diameter.
- There are some properties with sprinklers systems and the pay item list shows the item as a lump sum. We will recommend quantifying the pay item to avoid any change orders or claims from the contractor.
- There are several pay items without quantities, which will be addressed before the bidding process to eliminate them from the list and avoid any claims or confusion.
- Water meter impacts There are several water meters (WM) to be adjusted throughout the project and we will ensure the quantity and feasibility of the adjustment to mitigate any claim, such as relocation or broken water meter steel cages, and protection of the meter itself. We will strictly coordinate with the City's Project Manager and Water Department's Project Manager that all the related activities are in the best interest for the City.
- We assume that the Engineer of Record (EOR) tested the swales for percolation, but we independently will test some of them randomly and ensure that we have good drainage after we finish the reconstruction and regrading of the swales in the project. If we notice any anomaly, we will notify the City and EOR to search for a solution that resolves the problem of flooding and ponding water.
- Regarding the thermoplastic material, we will ensure that the contractor and subcontractor comply with material specifications and with the required testing to be approved by Broward County Traffic Engineering Division. We currently have CEI projects with the City of Pembroke Pines and have been collaborating with Mr. Carmelo Caratozzolo, PE and Mr. Paul Yang, PE involving the final inspections of these project.
- For the new sidewalk and Detectable Warning Systems (DWS), we will ensure compliance with ADA standards for 2% max. cross slope, and that ramps comply with the minimal requirements of slope.
- All incorporated materials will comply with Buy America Certified as per Federal Funds Project requirements. We have recently encountered contractors are having difficulties complying with this creating an issue in the project that can cause delays on the material procurement and delivery, penalizing the Local Agency on their reimbursements affecting the financial status of the Agency.
- There are numerous driveways along the corridor needing reconstruction. **RJ Behar** will be very vigilant beginning with the demolition and finalizing with the compaction and proper elevations to eradicate any ponding of water and that those

- slopes are redirected to the newly regraded swales.
- Matching Existing Concrete **RJ Behar** will be cognizant of the concrete, as the existing concrete must match the proper elevation relative to the new concrete or construction. There could also be obstructions that need to be addressed, as shown in the picture to the right, which has an existing sidewalk to match with a proposed one and two poles are obstructing the sidewalk. For the elevation issues, we will investigate and take spot elevation checks to anticipate any problems before the contractor tries to submit a claim. We are committed to this project and to keeping the City's budget within the best possible percentage related to the original contract cost.
- The tree removal and high voltage power lines in the area are a challenging task. RJ Behar will conduct a meeting with all the stakeholders, starting with FP&L and the contractor to establish lines of communication and safety guidelines before performing the activities.
- Existing signs to be protected The plans indicate that the contractor needs to protect "stop and other type of traffic signs." We recently encountered, on similar projects, that some of these signs have been removed or do not exist, which will require a change order from the contractor. **RJ Behar** will provide an inventory of these signs and recommend to the City how to address the missing signs to avoid any change to the contract before construction.



OVERALL APPROACH TO ACCOMPLISHING THE PROJECT

PUBLIC OUTREACH EFFORT DURING CONSTRUCTION

We understand that the work will take place in a community with an active and vocal organization. Communication with residents is extremely important in all projects in residential areas. Informing the public of the upcoming improvements, setting up presentations to demonstrate the project results, issuing informative bulletins, etc. is part of this process. We will provide any assistance, as requested, with these efforts. **RJ Behar** could, through the City, coordinate with the private stakeholders involved. We will organize public meetings, one-on-one meetings, conference calls; prepare presentations, brochures, renderings, project graphics, project website, respond to comments, and newsletters. At all public meetings, we will keep minutes or recordings as needed to document these meetings. We have used these services in many of our projects in the past. We performed these on the Lyons Park Improvement Project for the City of Pompano Beach and in Little Country Estates Drainage Improvement Project in the Town of Davie.



COMMUNITY CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS TO BE ADDRESSED/MINIMIZED:

Safety/MOT: Safety is of great importance during the construction project. The **RJ Behar Team** will be dedicated to minimizing the disruption of traffic and exercising extreme care to prevent damage to and interference with the existing utilities,

future improvements, and public safety throughout the neighborhood. MOT requires proper installation and key components, assuring the safety of the workers and the traveling public, and keeping everyone aware of scheduled or ongoing lane closures. We will create a safe environment and assist in maintaining an adequate traffic flow. **RJ Behar** places the utmost importance on MOT prior to and during the entire duration of the project. We will monitor all related operations for strict compliance with the Traffic Control Plan (TCP), FDOT's Design Standard's INDEX 600 and the current MUTCD. Other important features of the MOT include:

- RJ Behar will check MOT throughout the day-to-day operations and conduct on-site meetings no less than once per week.
- All flagmen working on the project must be certified and utilize hand-held radio communication. RJ Behar will check for valid certifications as part of our quality control program.
- All construction signs, arrow boards, VMS boards, temporary signals, and traffic control devices will be inspected daily.
- **RJ Behar's** Staff will ensure that the pedestrian passage is clean, safe, and free of obstructions. Minimum travel path will be 4 ft.
- All drop-offs will be protected, as per the Standard Index 600.
- Property access will always be maintained.
- RJ Behar's Staff will conduct weekend visits to ensure that all MOT devices are functional, clean, and clearly visible.

Noise/Dust Control: Consideration for neighbors regarding noise and dust control are important. The necessary precautions will be enforced during construction. Noise ordinance restrictions will be strictly adhered to, especially during vibratory operations, such as during earthwork and paving compaction and demolition efforts. The use of vacuum broom trucks along with water trucks may be required to keep dust control down to acceptable levels.

Driveway and Street Access Maintenance: Construction work will be planned and executed to minimize any inconvenience to residents and businesses regarding access to sidewalks, driveways, and alleys. The contractor will give written notice of at least 3-5 days to residents and businesses prior to removal of access. On-street parking removal creates a hardship for residents and businesses. The contractor will also provide written notice of at least 3-5 days for the removal of any fences, landscaping, or trees in addition to any other encumbrances in the ROW that is a part of the scope of the work. Parking removal time span starts when "no parking" signs are installed prior to sidewalk removal and ends when the signs have been removed after the backfill and/or seeding has been completed. Driveway and roadway access trenches will be covered each night to ensure access to driveways and parking.

U.S. Postal Service: Postal Service should not be interrupted during construction. Mailboxes that are in the ROW may have to be removed and replaced by the contractor, during the construction process.

Emergency Service: The contractor will ensure that there is no interruption to neighborhood emergency services (i.e., police, ambulance, fire rescue). Advanced notification to the various emergency response agencies, including fire rescue and police, of any lane closures will be part of **RJ Behar's** ongoing public involvement response task.

Utility Coordination: One of the greatest challenges on any project is the coordination and relocation of utilities. **RJ Behar's Team** will ensure that the contractor coordinates with all existing utility owners throughout the construction of the project and coordinates the utility locators with Sunshine 811 before any construction begins. To identify and resolve any conflicts that may affect the critical path, pre-utility meetings will be taking place with the participation of the EOR, utility representatives and the contractor. The contractor's proposed construction phasing plan will be thoroughly discussed so that all



required utility work is performed within time, and within the allowable schedule. The biggest problem we encounter all the time is that the utilities are not located where the utility owner had indicated. The most difficult to deal with are normally gas lines. We would recommend including some more information and notes in the plans to allow the contractor to understand the City's expectations and include that in their bids. Working within the neighborhood streets, only one block should be closed at a time, and temporary signals should be used, pedestrian traffic must be detoured around the work zone, driveway access will always be maintained.

Environmental/Stormwater and Erosion Control: The contractor will provide an Erosion Control Plan for maintaining all erosion and sediment controls throughout construction. The contractor will install proper stabilization measures to minimize erosion, retain sediment, and prevent discharging pollutants. Controls may include installation of filter fabric for inlet protection, litter control and waste collection, floating turbidity barriers, controlling offsite vehicle tracking of sediments, dust control, covering trucks with tarps, use of roadway sweepers, and removal of excess dirt from roadways daily. Our team will ensure that all construction activities are performed in compliance with the NPDES permit requirements, within the allowable methods outlined in the approved stormwater pollution prevention plan, and that the contractor implement best management practices (BMP's) to avoid environmental impacts. The contractor's staging area will be carefully reviewed and coordinated with the City's Project Manager to ensure that the proposed location and construction activities do not pose environmental risks or threats to the surrounding areas.

Work will consist of the construction, removal and repair of sidewalk surfaces and appurtenances, including tree removal, and MOT at various locations in the City of Hollywood. Work will vary by location. All locations are subject to change, and the contractor will not proceed at any location without first receiving permission from the Project Manager. Locations may be modified, added, or subtracted, throughout the contract period. Quantities in this bid are approximate only and have been assumed for the purpose of obtaining unit prices. The City of Hollywood expressly reserves the right to increase or reduce quantities as it deems necessary. Any such increases will include an extension of time to the contractor to complete the work. The contractor will, upon receipt of notice to proceed, perform such sidewalk and related work, and will receive compensation for same at the unit prices establish.

VISION, IDEAS AND METHODOLOGY

Cooperation and Coordination with City Staff: Coordination of a multi-member team requires regular attention. All matters related to the project will be coordinated with the City's Staff. We will minimize the City's day-to-day involvement by keeping the City informed electronically. RJ Behar's Senior Project Engineer will serve as our focal point of coordination and for providing timely responses and prompt follow-up. Mr. Santana will be the link with the project team. We will always keep the City's Staff well-informed of all project issues. Recognizing that City's Staff may be assigned numerous activities at any given time, we will update the City's Staff by maximizing electronic information transfer (e-mail), utilizing a dedicated project SHAREPOINT SITE, with different access permissions depending on the user. All information is timely, archived, and localized. We will also communicate with video calls and provide prompt meeting minutes. We will schedule progress meetings as often as the project requires.

Partnering: RJ Behar's Team believes and practices a proactive approach to manage and oversee all construction activities, to be able to provide immediate field engineering solutions to resolve critical items or conflicts, prior to issues escalating and causing delays and affecting the overall project schedule and money goals. Our team's experience and training has increased our awareness of potential problems and allows us to be in control and ahead of "the game". We will schedule separate meetings with Kimley Horn (Design Team) and the prime contractor prior to having the preconstruction conference, and begin setting up an environment of cooperation, trust, and commitment to the project. It is important to have a clear understanding from the design team as to what commitments have been made to the stakeholders/community and what are the activities that they foresee as potential conflicts during construction. The Partnering approach helps to anticipate, identify, and resolve problems before they impact the project - safety, time, and cost goals, by eliminating or at least reducing conflicts, litigation, and claims. It also enhances the effectiveness of the team, establishes common expectations, understanding, and the means of communicating effectively and resolving issues as they arise. Some of the opportunities that will be created are:

- Effective and Efficient Resolution of Issues
- A Successful Project Closeout



- Higher Performance Rating
- Enhanced Safety
- Increased Collaboration between all Stakeholders

Up-To-Date Technology: The **RJ Behar** Inspection staff team will be equipped with laptop computers and high-speed internet air cards, which enables them to have full remote access to their emails, daily document reports, project tracking spreadsheets, etc. These features help to expedite communication with the office and City Staff at a moment's notice, complete their daily site manager entries, as well as enter sample and test information on-the-spot from the project site without having to be physically in the office. Additionally, our inspectors utilize smart phones and tablets that have scanning capabilities, which allows them to transmit any marked up field documentation, plan sheets, etc. to the appropriate parties, which in turn can be resolved in the field without any further delay. Our field inspectors use **Bluebeam Revu** to markup and redline their plan drawings and sheets, insert photos and other annotations onto the document page, making it easy, versatile, and an efficient way of sending RFIs and report any project issues to the team. **RJ Behar** understands that availability of fast and reliable information from our inspection team and communication with the City is key in ensuring favorable project quality results. Our staff is capable of video conferencing from the jobsite via web-based meetings to quickly disseminate project issues by having direct communication with the project management team and the Engineer of Record for immediate resolution of issues. Our inspectors obtain the contractors' schedules and ensure that an inspector is always on the site.

Construction Management: The key to our success in providing contract administration services includes:

- Proper interpretation of the construction bid documents,
- Maintaining detailed documentation throughout the construction,
- Documenting change orders and quantity revisions,
- Documenting changes in field conditions, and
- Being responsive.

Material Testing and Acceptance: Our CEI Team will review the contractor's Quality Control Plan prior to project commencement for adequacy. It is important that all materials brought to the project come from an FDOT approved source (concrete, steel, asphalt, etc.), be certified, and/or be on the FDOT Approved Products List (APL). The contractor must provide a quality control laboratory to sample and test the materials, as required by the project specifications. The CEI Team will perform the required verification testing. It is also very important that all manufacturing processes take place domestically, according to the "Buy America" provisions that are required on all Federal (LAP) Funded Projects. The RJB Team is very familiar with the LAP Final Close-Out procedures for FDOT Broward Operations. Our Team will utilize a tracking and documentation system for pay items and materials sampling to set up logs and spreadsheets. RJB will request and schedule courtesy field reviews during the progress of the job (30%-60%-90%) from FDOT Broward Operations, Final Estimates Administrator. Some of the key highlights for preparing and submitting a zero-error Final Close-Out and Material Certification package include:

- Final estimate checklist, time folder; quantity overrun-under run summary; weather and holidays extensions
- RFIs, supplemental agreements; work orders; fuel and diesel adjustments
- Signed and sealed as built plans, correspondence folder
- Project documentation is in order and all documents uploaded on GAP.
- Material certification package; approved quality control plan; monthly & final construction compliance certifications
- Material test sampling records closed out prior to project acceptance.
- All contractors' warranty documentation submitted by final acceptance

PROJECT ADMINISTRATION

Schedule Control: RJ Behar is completely familiar with the logic involved in scheduling projects. We utilize Primavera software for scheduling, with the Claim Digger application for tracking changes from the original baseline schedule. **RJ Behar** will request and review the contractor's two week look-ahead schedules to forecast upcoming work, and coordinate/monitor the field operations to assist in achieving anticipated target dates. With each progress application for payment, the contractor will be required to submit an updated and revised monthly CPM schedule clearly showing the progress of the construction work and impacts to work activities, if any. **RJ Behar** will closely monitor daily work activities, paying special attention to



crew's production rates, which in our experience, serves as another tool and barometer for measuring work performance and forecasting problems and project setbacks.

- ✓ Our Team will review and analyze the contractor's work breakdown structure and compare schedule logic with required construction activities.
- ✓ The contractor's original baseline schedule will be received at the preconstruction meeting, and reviewed by our CEI Team for activities logic, sequencing, duration, milestones, submittals, material procurement, and overall compliance with the contract documents.
- ✓ The CEI Team will monitor the construction phase and compare the contractor's progress schedule to the actual work completed to verify progress payments.
- ✓ Any delays or deviations from the approved project baseline will immediately be brought to the attention of City Staff for remedies to the contractor including but not limited to acceleration, increase manpower and equipment, and authorization of additional workdays/hours.
- Regarding extensions of time, the CEI Team will verify that any affected activities are on the critical path for the project, and have no float, prior to recommending any approval of time extensions.

RFI's/Shop Drawings Submittals Reviews: RJ Behar is aware of the time sensitivity factor in reviewing project submittals from the contractor, such as RFIs and Shop Drawings. We will keep a tracking log for each project submittal, documenting all the major milestones from when date received all the way to the date approved and submitted back to the contractor. Although the FDOT Standard Specifications allows up to 45 days for the review of shop drawing submittals and up to 14 days for RFI's, we will coordinate closely with the EOR and ensure they perform expeditious reviews - within 3 to 5 business days for RFIs, and within 5 to 7 business days for shop drawings.

As-Built Records: The **RJB Team** will maintain, daily, a complete and accurate record of all activities and events related to each project operation and confirm the verification process of all work completed including pay item quantities. Our Project Administrator/Contract Support Specialist will document any significant event or change performed to ensure an accurate asbuilt record of the project.

Change Management: In case a contract requires change, the **RJ Behar Team** is adept at managing and implementing contract change in keeping with the provisions defining the steps and procedures required by the City to approve and implement the proposal. **RJB** will strictly adhere to the process, from contract change request (issued by either party) through to claim, if necessary. **RJB's** pro-active management and reporting style will allow the city to implement only the changes it requests or reduces the cost; construction impacts or delays.

Documentation/Records Retention: Keeping accurate day to day records of the project activities, logging, and tracking RFIs and Shop Drawings, and monitoring the construction schedule will be part of **RJB's** ongoing task to ensure that the project is delivered on time. It is extremely important that all project documentation and records be maintained not only throughout the construction period, but for a period of up to five years, as per the LAP Agreement. Our team will ensure that project files contain all required documentation, agency coordination letters, checklists, State LAP Agreements, permits, change orders, preliminary engineering reports, construction records, diaries, field books, material test reports, certified payrolls, labor compliance reviews, EEO reviews, etc., and these are all submitted to the City of Hollywood at the Final Project Close-Out Package. Our CEI Team will make certain that these project documents are received and submitted in a timely manner. Below are some of the guidelines that the **RJ Behar's** Team will implement, so that the City of Hollywood remains in compliance.

- Anticipated Disadvantage Business Enterprise Participation Statement needs to be submitted within three days of the
 preconstruction meeting to the Resident Compliance Specialist (RCS). The RCS will then send this document to
 FDOT to be forwarded to Tallahassee.
- The Job-Site Bulletin Board needs to be inspected and in place prior to the first day of work.
- Attend the initial meeting with the FDOT oversight compliance specialist to review the contract and all the contract provisions.
- Prepare, maintain, and organize the compliance records for the City.
- Compile project data to fill out and update FDOT Compliance Checklists.
- Submit monthly LAP Compliance Checklist to the Oversight Compliance Specialist on or before the first of every month until the project is complete.



- Submit any payroll violations to the FDOT Oversight Compliance specialist at the end of each month with the A-E checklists.
- Monitor all DBE activity to ensure the FDOT Commercially Useful Function Forms are filled out at the start of any DBE on the project, and for the First three months they are active.
- Ensure that all DBE payments are entered into GAP System prior to the closeout of the project, to ensure the city gets reimbursed by FDOT.
- Conduct and review employee EEO labor interviews with the contractor's employees, as per FDOT LAP requirements for contractors to ensure that all DBE and EEO/AA subcontractors are paid timely, and payments are verified.
- Review and Maintain subcontracts in the compliance files as required.

Quality Control: Our CEI Team will review the contractors Quality Control Plan for verification that it meets the overall intent of the contract documents, perform in-house and laboratory verification testing of materials as required, verify that all materials installed at the site meet or exceed the specifications, monitor the delivery and placement of steel, Limerock, asphalt, concrete and all associated materials for adherence to the specifications, perform any and all inspections as required/requested by the engineer for conformance. Periodic Quality Assurance Reviews (QARs) are conducted by FDOT to measure adherence to the established LAP quality assurance procedures. **RJ Behar** will ensure that the City and contractor are in full compliance with all LAP Federal mandates and receives successful QARs from FDOT's District Lap Administrator.

As previously stated, **RJ Behar** has completed over 100 projects administrated under the LAP Program for several municipalities. Many of these projects underwent comprehensive national and state reviews with USDOT, USDOL, FHWA, and FDOT. **RJ Behar** received excellent commendations for each of these successful reviews. The Team proposed for this contract possesses the experience required under the LAP requirements to bring this project to a successful completion.

Understanding the City of Hollywood's Vulnerability to the Effects of Climate Change and Sea Level Rise

The City of Hollywood is actively working to adapt its infrastructure to the challenges of climate change and its implications, including sea level rise. The City is recognized as a leader in environmental sustainability and its engagement in sustainability efforts throughout the South Florida region.



In May of 2020, the City of Hollywood completed a Citywide Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Plan. The report included a climatological impact analysis and preliminary adaptation planning efforts for critical citywide assets. The four threat categories of climate impact analyzed included:

- Sea Level Rise (SLR)
- Storm Surge (SS)

- Extreme Precipitation (EP), and
- Extreme Heat (EH)

Goals to Address Resiliency Through the Project: The main function of the CEI Team is contract administration, inspection, and materials sampling and testing for the construction of the proposed sidewalk network to ensure the construction meets the intent of the design and contract documents. Although there are limited measures that can be taken by the CEI team regarding the selection of materials for the sidewalk construction, there are measures that can be taken to ensure a more resilient project.

- The tree canopy cover is a natural method of mitigation used to address some of the vulnerability aspects related to climate change. Our Team will be paying special attention to contractor's operations to avoid unnecessary impacts to the existing tree canopy.
- The plans call for thicker sidewalks (6-inch) at driveway locations. Our inspectors will verify that this thickened sidewalk is provided by the contractor.
- There are details to address tree roots (root barriers). Our CEI team will verify all the locations where this treatment is needed and identify early if additional areas, besides the ones called for in the contract, are needed.
- Sidewalks will last longer when they are constructed over a stable base and have the proper joint spacing. This will require the CEI team to be vigilant of the grading and compaction efforts of the sidewalk base. The base construction will also require proper testing to ensure the required 98% compaction density.
- The sidewalk's cross slope should ensure efficient drainage without being too steep. A 2% cross slope is called for in the plans. Our team will be using smart levels to verify proper slopes are provided.
- Proper drainage is another measure that can address vulnerability against these threats. Green infrastructure techniques
 like retention swales used in the project will also help to reduce the volume of runoff and take pressure off the drainage
 system. Our team will be verifying proper grading of the swale areas next to the sidewalks.
- Better sidewalks require a combination of stable, slip and flood-resistant materials based on site needs. A 3000 psi
 concrete with a broom finish has been selected for this project. In future projects, the City may also consider the use of
 porous concrete to reduce runoff potential.

Conclusion: Our Team believes that the key issues for this project include maintaining close coordination and communication with City Staff; coordinating with the residents and utility companies; incorporating pedestrian friendly features; cost and schedule control, and most importantly being responsive to the City. **RJ Behar** is committed to addressing these issues and providing the highest possible quality of CEI service. We pledge personalized service and will assure the overall successful completion, in terms of quality, timeliness, and budget. The City can always expect the following from the **RJB Team:**

Upon delivery to the Agency of said document(s), the Agency will become the custodian thereof in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Consultant will not copyright any material and products or patent any invention developed under this agreement. The Agency will have the right to visit the site for inspection of the work and the products of the Consultant at any time.
- C. Nor shall the same be construed to constitute agreement by CONSULTANT to indemnify CITY for the negligent acts or omissions of CITY, its officers, agents, or employees, or third parties. Nor shall the same be construed to constitute agreement by CONSULTANT to indemnify the Department for the negligent acts or omissions of the Department, its officers, agents, or employees, or third parties. This indemnification shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 12 - SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

The City and the CONSULTANT each bind itself and its partners, successors, executors, administrators and assigns to the other party of this Contract and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns of such other party, in respect to all covenants of this Contract. Except as above, neither the City nor the CONSULTANT shall assign, sublet, encumber, convey or transfer its interest in this Contract without the prior written consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of the City which may be a party hereto, nor shall it be construed as giving any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than the City and the CONSULTANT.

ARTICLE 13 - REMEDIES

This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Any and all legal action between the parties arising out of the Contract will be brought in Broward County. No remedy herein conferred upon any party is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at they or in equity or by statute or otherwise. No single or partial exercise by any party of they right, power, or remedy hereunder shall preclude any other or further exercise thereof.

ARTICLE 14 - CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The CONSULTANT represents that it has no strest and shall acquire no interest, either direct or indirect, which would conflict in any in oner with the performance of services required hereunder, as provided for in the Coas of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees (Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statue). The CONSULTANT further represents that no person who has any interest shall be apployed for said performance.

The CONSULTANT shall prolopte heavy the City's representative, in writing, by certified mail, of all potential cortices of heerest for any prospective business association, interest, or other circumstance which may influence or appear to influence the CONSULTANT'S judgment or quality service being provided hereunder. Such written notification shall identify the prospective business association, interest or circumstance, the nature of work that the CONSULTANT may undertake and request an opinion of the City as to whether the association, interest or circumstance would, in the opinion of the City, constitute a conflict of interest if entered into by the CONSULTANT. The City agrees to notify the CONSULTANT of its opinion by certified mail within 30 days of receipt of notice by the CONSULTANT. If in the opinion of the CITY, the prospective business association, interest or circumstance would not constitute a conflict of interest by the CONSULTANT, the CITY shall so state in the notice and the CONSULTANT shall, at its option, enter into said association, interest or circumstance and it shall be deemed not in conflict of interest with respect to services provided to the City by the CONSULTANT under the terms of this Contract.

ARTICLE 15 - EXCUSABLE DELAYS


The CONSULTANT shall not be considered in default by reason of any failure in performance if such failure arises out of causes reasonably beyond the control of the CONSULTANT or its subcontractors and without their fault or negligence. Such causes

include, but are not limited to: acts of God; natural or public health emergencies; freight embargoes; and abnormally severe and unusual weather conditions.

Upon the CONSULTANT'S request, the City shall consider the facts and extent of any failure to perform the work and, if the CONSULTANT'S failure to perform was without it or its subcontractors' fault or negligence, the Contract Schedule and/or any other affected provision of this Contract shall be revised accordingly; subject to the City's rights to change, terminate, or stop any or all of the work at any time.

ARTICLE 16 - DEBT

The CONSULTANT shall not pledge the City's credit or attempt to make it a guarantor of payment or surety for any contract, debt, obligation, judgment, lien, or any form of indebtedness. The CONSULTANT further warrants and represents that it has no obligation or indebtedness that would impair its ability to fulfill the terms of this Contract.



ARTICLE 17 - DISCLOSURE AND OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

The CONSULTANT shall deliver to the City's Representative for approval and acceptance, and before being eligible for final payment of any amounts due, all documents and materials prepared by and for the City under this Contract.

All written and oral information, not in the public domain or not previously known, and all information and data obtained, developed, or supplied by the City or at its expense will be kept confidential by the CONSULTANT and will not be disclosed to any other party, directly or indirectly, without the City's prior written consent unless required by a lawful order. All drawings, maps, sketches, programs, database, reports, and other data developed, or purchased, under this Contract for or at the City's expense shall be and remain the City's property and may be reproduced and reused at the discretion of the City.

The City and the CONSULTANT shall comply with the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes (Public Records Law). Pursuant to Section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, any party contracting with CITY is required to (a) keep and maintain a labele for public inspection any records that pertain to services rendered under this Agreement; (b) provide the public with access to public records on the same terms and and ons that the City would provide such records and at a cost that does not exceed to cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or as otherwise provided by w; (c) ensurement public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public a cords disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law; and the most an requirements for retaining public records and transfer, at no cost, to Call prolic records in that party's possession upon termination of its contract with City and a soloy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from a blic scords disclosure requirements. All of such party's records stored electronically must be provided to City in a format that is compatible with the City's informat an echlology systems. Each party shall maintain its own respective records and docume to as ociated with this Agreement in accordance with the records retention retain ments oplicable to public records. ARTICLE 18 - CONTINGENT FEES

The CONSULTANT warrants that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT to solicit or secure this Contract and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual, or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT, any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Contract. Violation of this Article shall constitute a forfeiture of this Contract by CONSULTANT.

ARTICLE 19 - ACCESS AND AUDITS

The CONSULTANT shall maintain adequate records to justify all charges, expenses, and costs incurred in estimating and performing the work for at least five (5) years after completion of this Contract or until completion of any audit, whichever is later. The City shall have access to such books, records, and documents as required in this section for the purpose of inspection or audit during normal business hours, at the CONSULTANT'S place of business.

ARTICLE 20 - NONDISCRIMINATION

The CONSULTANT warrants and represents that all of its employees are treated equally during employment without regard to race, color, religion, disability, sex, age, national origin, ancestry, marital status, or sexual orientation.

ARTICLE 21 - INTERPRETATION

The language of this Contract has been agreed to by both part is to express their mutual intent and no rule of strict construction shall be applied to eithe party bereto. The headings are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the reaning or interpretation of this Agreement. All personal pronouns used in the Agreement shall include the other gender, and the singular, the plural, and vice years, rules the context otherwise requires.

ARTICLE 22 - AUTHORITY TO PRACTICE

The CONSULTANT hereby represents and warrants that it has and will continue to maintain all licenses and approvals required to add this business and that it will at all times conduct its business activities in a reputable manner. Proof of such licenses and approvals shall be submitted to the City's representative upon request.

ARTICLE 23 - SEVERALITY

If any term or provide of this Contract, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, to the remainder of this Contract, or the application of such terms or provision, to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected, and every other term and provision of this Contract shall be deemed valid and enforceable to the extent permitted by law.

ARTICLE 24 - ENTIRETY OF CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT

The City and the CONSULTANT agree that this Contract together with the Exhibits hereto, sets forth the entire agreement between the parties and that there are no promises or understandings other than those stated herein. It is further agreed that no modification, amendment, or alteration in the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document executed with the same formality and of equal dignity herewith. None of the provisions, terms, and conditions contained in this Contract may be added to, modified, superseded, or otherwise altered, except by a written instrument executed by the parties hereto in accordance with Article 25 - Modification of Work. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between this Contract and the provisions in the

incorporated Exhibits, the terms of this Contract shall supersede and prevail over the terms in the Exhibits.

ARTICLE 25 - MODIFICATION OF SCOPE OF WORK

The City reserves the right to make changes in the Scope of Work, including alterations, reductions therein, or additions thereto. Upon receipt by the CONSULTANT of the City's notification of a contemplated change, the CONSULTANT shall, in writing: (1) provide a detailed estimate for the increase or decrease in cost due to the contemplated change, (2) notify the City of any estimated change in the completion date, and (3) advise the CITY if the contemplated change shall affect the CONSULTANT'S ability to meet the completion dates or schedules of this Contract.

If the City so instructs in writing, the CONSULTANT shall suspend work on that portion of the Scope of Work affected by a contemplated change, pending the City's decision to proceed with the change.

If the City elects to make the change, the CITY shall initiate a Contract Amendment and the CONSULTANT shall not commence work on any stab change until such written amendment is signed by the CONSULTANT and the CITY, and if such amendment is in excess of \$50,000 it must also first be approved by the CITY commission and signed by the appropriate City Official authorized by the City Commission.

The City shall not be liable for payment of any artitional or modified work which is not authorized in the manner provided for by his A time.

ARTICLE 26 - NOTICE

All notices required in this Contract shall be antiby certified mail, return receipt requested, and if sent to the City shall be inclied to:

If applicable, City may withhold any payments then due to CONSULTANT until CONSULTANT complies with the provisions of this section.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONSULTANT WORK PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

STATEMENT OF POLICY:

It is the policy of the City of Hollywood (City) to establish a method for evaluating and reporting the work performance of professional services consultants under contract.

For work receiving Federal funds, which are overseen by the Florida Department of Transportation, through the Local Agency Program require evaluation per 23 CFR 172.

PURPOSE:

The City contracts with professional services consultants to provide a variety of services to the City. This procedure provides the City with a means of evaluating the work performance of those consultants. For all professional services contracts, the consultant's work performance for each advertised major type of work must be evaluated by the PM. Consultants may also be evaluated on minor types of work if that work is considered significant by the PM. Contracts which do not exceed Category Two thresholds, as established by **Section 287.017**, **F.S.**, are exempt and do not require evaluation.

SCOPE:

This procedure will apply to all professional services contracts and Design-Build contracts.

Principal users of this procedure will be project managers.

DEFINITIONS:

City Hall: The City's headquarters offices, located in Tallahassee.

Consultant Evaluation (CE) System: City's enterprise application consultant evaluation system.

Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI): Personnel, whether consultant or City employee, providing construction engineering and inspection services.

Construction Project Manager (CPM): The City employee whose duties include managing CEI consultant contracts.

Design Project Manager (DPM): The City employee whose duties include managing design consultant contracts.

Director of the Design and Construction Management Department (Director): The City representative working for the City Construction Engineer, who administers the Consultant CEI work program.

ESS Construction Manager (ESSM): The engineer appointed by the Director to hold the title of ESS Construction Manager and who serves to manage all City functions pertaining to construction of City projects.

City Engineer (CE): The engineer appointed by the City Manager to hold the title of City Engineer and who serves to manage all City functions pertaining to design of City projects.

Notice to Proceed (NTP): Notification given by the City's Project Manager to the consultant to begin work on the contract Scope of Services, or part thereof, on which date the timing of periodic evaluations of the consultant begins.

Project Manager (PM): A City employee whose duties include managing professional service contracts between consultants and the City.

Technical Reviewer: A designated technical expert for a specific type of work who has reviewed the consultant's work product.

Type of Work: The City has categorized the types of professional services it generally requires into a Type of Work listing in *Rule 14-75.003, F.A.C.* These types of work are

the basis for qualification of consultants.

1. ALL PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS

1.1 Processing of Evaluation

For each major type of work advertised, evaluations on contracts shall be entered by the PM into CE. Upon completion of all prescribed City approvals, CE automatically emails evaluations to recipients designated in CE.

To assure all parties' understanding, the City's PM shall discuss the evaluation rating criteria with consultant PM before the consultant begins work.

The City's PM is responsible for completing interim and final performance evaluations. The PM shall discuss the evaluations with consultant before entry into CE to provide an opportunity for communication and feedback on the level of performance.

1.2 Evaluation Scale

The consultant evaluation rating scale shall be as follows:

- 5 = Outstanding performance
- 4 = Above Satisfactory performance
- 3 = Satisfactory performance
- 2 = Below Satisfactory performance
- 1 = Unacceptable performance

Comments are encouraged for every assigned rating, but must be entered in the comment section for a rating of 5 or 1.

2. PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS FOR CEI CONSULTANTS

- **2.1** The evaluation of a CEI consultant shall be performed by the CPM, and shall be provided on the following schedule:
 - (A) The CPM shall complete the initial interim evaluation at the end of the first full quarter of contract performance. Quarters are defined as follows:

1st Quarter: January – March 2nd Quarter: April – June

3rd Quarter: July – September 4th Quarter: October – December

- (1) Interim performance evaluations shall be completed within 30 days after the end of the quarter.
- (2) The final evaluation shall cover the period from the previous evaluation to the end of the contract.
- (3) The evaluation of the overall performance for the entire contract period shall be the average of all evaluations (interim and final) for the contract, and is automatically calculated in CE.
- **(B)** The CPM shall distribute the evaluation and any follow up correspondence as follows:
 - (1) Evaluation is 3.0 or greater: Consultant and Director of the Design and Construction Management Department receive a copy for information.
 - (2) Evaluation is less than 3.0:

ESSM: Receives a copy for disposition. The ESSM may direct that the evaluation be changed to 3.0 or greater, upon which step (1) above shall apply. The ESSM may agree with the evaluation, upon which the following shall apply:

- **a.** The **Consultant** receives a copy. The transmittal letter shall indicate what corrective action is necessary and the related time frame and request a response to this action.
- **b.** The Director of the Design and Construction Management Department receives a copy.
- **c.** The **Director of the Office of Construction** receives a copy from the ESSM.
- (C) Commendatory or critical comments shall be included in the evaluation to fully explain the intent of the evaluation. The CPM

shall provide as much documentation as deemed necessary to fully explain the conditions encountered in the field. Input provided by appropriate City and construction contractor personnel should be considered.

- **2.2** CEI consultant evaluations shall be completed using either the project-specific CEI evaluation criteria or the CEI Hybrid criteria, applicable.
- **2.3** If a particular performance test item does not apply to a project, it should not be used in the calculation of the weighted average for the performance test area.
- 2.4 The consultant CEI performance evaluation is a summary record of the CPM's indepth reports of the CEI Consultant, the Quality Assurance Reviews prepared by the Specialty Engineer from the Office of Construction, and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Monthly Field Reports. These source documents should be used as the basis for preparation of this performance evaluation and shall serve as the in-depth, back-up data needed to substantiate the numerical evaluation given.
- 2.5 The City's PM may offer the consultant CEI the opportunity to request a meeting to discuss a grade with the ESSM within ten calendar days of receipt of the evaluation. The ESSM shall consider any information submitted by the consultant and decide whether the performance evaluation will be revised. The ESSM's decision is final.

3. PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS FOR NON-CEI TYPES OF WORK

The PM for the consultant contract shall complete an evaluation of the prime consultant's performance in the following areas:

- Schedule
- Management
- Quality
- Constructability (for contracts that produce construction plans)

3.1 Evaluation Areas

- (A) Schedule: Prepared by the PM for the contract, this evaluation reflects the consultant's performance in meeting the contract schedule. Criteria for the schedule evaluation can be found in CE.
- **(B) Management:** Prepared by the PM for the contract, this evaluation reflects the consultant's performance in managing the contract. The following areas shall be considered when performing this evaluation:
 - Administration of Contract
 - Management of Issues and Resources
 - Communication. Documentation and Coordination
 - Execution of Work
 - Post Design Services (completed with constructability evaluation)

Criteria for each area of the Management Evaluation can be found in CE.

(C) Quality: Prepared by the PM or the technical reviewer for each major type of work included in the advertisement for the services, this evaluation reflects the consultant's attention and concern to the established quality assurance plan and delivering a quality service and product.

Quality evaluation criteria for individual work types can be found in CE. This includes any specific criteria regarding the evaluation responsibility of the PM, the technical reviewer and any additional concurrence requirements for the specific quality evaluation.

For advertised types of work other than those pre-qualified by the City, Category 99 shall be used, with appropriate criteria aCEd by the PM.

Sub-consultant: A quality evaluation shall be assigned to any pre-qualified sub-consultant named in the contract who performs a major type of work, or who signs and seals design plans. At the option of the PM, the prime consultant may receive a quality evaluation in the same types of work performed by the sub-consultant.

(D) Constructability (Post Construction): The Constructability
Evaluation reflects the design consultant's ability to develop constructible (practical, accurate, complete, and cost effective) construction plans. For all professional services contracts resulting in construction plans, the CPM shall prepare an evaluation of the constructability of the design consultant's plans and a management evaluation on the performance of post design services. In preparing

these evaluations, the CPM shall solicit input from the construction contractor and the consultant's project administrator. After review of the comments received from the construction contractor, appropriate comments shall be entered on the evaluation by the CPM. The evaluation shall be reviewed by the DPM for concurrence prior to entry into CE and prior to distribution to the design consultant. Specific criteria for the *Constructability Evaluation* and the *Post-Design Services Management Evaluation* can be found in CE.

3.2 When to Evaluate

For professional services contracts resulting in the production of construction plans, an evaluation is required according to the matrix below, but not to exceed 12 months since the last evaluation or **Notice to Proceed**.

A constructability evaluation and a management evaluation for post design services shall be performed within 30 days after final acceptance of the construction contract.

For contracts that do not produce construction plans, an evaluation is required for each 12 months of contract period from the *NTP*. A final evaluation shall be made within 30 days after completion and acceptance of basic services.

The evaluation of the overall performance for the entire contract period shall be the average of all evaluations (interim and final) for the contract. It is automatically calculated in CE.

For all professional services contracts, additional evaluations may be submitted upon completion of critical phases of work, such as preliminary design, submittal of draft environmental documents, phase submittals, reports and completion of *Task Works Orders (TWO)*. Reasons to be considered for submitting additional evaluations include:

- Recognition of outstanding performance
- Notification of unacceptable performance
- Requests from the consultant based on possible improved performance

3.3 Composite Evaluation

A composite evaluation shall be available at any point during the contract. The composite evaluation shall be calculated automatically by CE and shall include all evaluations completed up to that point in time. All evaluations associated with the contract shall be part of the calculation to determine the Final Composite Evaluation for the contract. The composite evaluation shall be calculated as follows:

(A) Contracts that Produce Construction Plans:

(1) **Design:** A composite evaluation calculated during the design phase of the project shall be calculated as follows:

Schedule (S): Average of all schedule evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the design phase.

Management (M): Average of all management evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the design phase.

Quality (Q): Average of all quality evaluations. This average shall be 50% of the composite evaluation calculated during the design phase.

Composite Evaluation = $(0.25 \times S) + (0.25 \times M) + (0.50 \times Q)$

Construction: A composite evaluation calculated during the construction phase of the project shall be calculated as follows:

Schedule (S): Average of all schedule evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the construction phase.

Management (M): A weighted average of all the management evaluations completed during the design and construction phase. The management evaluations made during design shall be 70% of the weighted average, while the management evaluations completed during construction shall be 30% of the weighted average. This weighted average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the construction phase.

M = 0.70 x (average of management evaluations during design) +0.30 x (average of management evaluations during construction).

Quality (Q): Average of all quality evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the construction phase.

Constructability (C): The Constructability evaluation shall be conducted once at completion of construction. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation calculated during the construction phase.

End of Construction Composite Evaluation shall be calculated as follows:

Composite Evaluation = (0.25xS) + (0.25xM) + (0.25xQ) + (0.25xC)

(B) All other Contracts:

Schedule (S) = Average of all schedule evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation.

Management (M) = Average of all management evaluations. This average shall be 25% of the composite evaluation.

Quality (Q) = Average of all quality evaluations. This average shall be 50% of the composite evaluation.

Composite Evaluation = $(0.25 \times S) + (0.25 \times M) + (0.50 \times Q)$

3.4 The City PM may offer the consultant the opportunity to request a meeting to discuss a grade with the office head to whom the PM reports within ten calendar days of receipt of the evaluation. The office head shall consider any information submitted by the consultant and decide whether the grade will be revised. The Office head's decision is final.

4. PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS FOR DESIGN-BUILD CONSULTANTS

Design-Build performance evaluations shall be entered into CE.

CPM for the Design-Build contract shall coordinate with the DPM and complete an evaluation of the Design-Build consultant's performance in the following areas:

- Quality
- Constructability

4.1 Evaluation Areas

Design-Build Consultant Performance Evaluations include specific criteria regarding the evaluation responsibility of the PM and the technical reviewer and additional concurrence requirements for specific quality and constructability evaluations. Evaluations shall be entered in CE.

(A) Quality (Q): For each Professional Services Work Type included in the advertisement for the services, the CPM and DPM shall conduct a quality evaluation. This evaluation reflects the consultant's attention and concern to the established quality assurance plan and delivering a quality service and product.

Subconsultant: A quality evaluation shall be assigned to any prequalified sub-consultant named in the contract who performs a major work type, or who signs and seals design plans. At the option of the PM, the design consultant may receive a quality evaluation in the same types of work performed by the sub-consultant.

(B) Constructability (C): The constructability evaluation reflects the design consultant's ability to develop constructible (practical, accurate, and complete) construction plans. For all contracts resulting in construction plans, the CPM shall prepare a constructability evaluation of the design consultant's plans. Appropriate comments shall be entered on the evaluation by the CPM and DPM. The evaluation shall be reviewed and signed by the CE and ESSM for concurrence prior to distribution to the design consultant. Specific criteria is in CE.

4.2 When to Evaluate

Evaluation is required according to the matrix below.

Quality evaluations: Additional (interim) evaluations may be conducted. Reasons to be considered for submitting additional evaluations include:

- Recognition of outstanding performance
- Notification of unacceptable performance
- Requests from the consultant based on possible improved performance

The constructability evaluation shall be performed within 30 days after final acceptance of the construction contract.

4.3 Composite Evaluation

A composite quality evaluation shall be the average of all interim quality evaluations, including the final quality evaluation.

A composite overall evaluation shall be calculated as follows:

Composite overall evaluation = (0.50xQ) + (0.50xC)

4.4 The City's PM may offer the Design-Build consultant the opportunity to request a meeting to discuss a grade with the CE and ESSM within ten calendar days of receipt of the evaluation. The CE and ESSM shall consider any information submitted by the consultant and decide whether the performance evaluation will be revised. The decision of the CE and ESSM is final.

5. TRAINING

The Department of Design and Construction Management will develop and deliver training in the use of this procedure on an as-needed basis.
