- 1. Are there criteria as far as what companies or services need cyber insurance? I guess we are trying to understand why cellular service providers need cyber insurance.
- 2. Most of our purchases are done via piggyback contracts. If the contracts we piggyback already have insurance requirements, are the vendors required to provide us additional insurance upon request or are we bound by the insurance terms provided in the contract and if they are not acceptable, then we cannot use that contract?
