A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE FINAL RANKING FOR MOVING COMPANIES; AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE HIGHEST-RANKED FIRM TO PROVIDE MOVING SERVICES FOR THE NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS PROJECT, A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND PROJECT, IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$300,000.00.

WHEREAS, the Department of Design and Construction Management ("DCM") desires to hire a company to provide moving services for the New Police Headquarters project, a General Obligation Bond project; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department requires the services of moving professionals to relocate staff computer equipment, files and personal items, equipment, and some furniture and storage items from the existing Police Headquarters building and other offsite locations to the New Police Headquarters building; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 2025, Request for Qualification Number RFQ-367-26-JJ ("RFQ") was electronically advertised on OpenGov.com to solicit moving services for the New Police Headquarters project, in accordance with Section 38.43(A) of the Procurement Code; and

WHEREAS, on January 15, 2026, RFQ-367-26-JJ was closed, and six proposals were received from the following firms:

1. All Things Moving & Storage Solutions LLC
2. Coleman Worldwide Moving, LLC
3. 1800Packouts of South Miami
4. Moving Solutions Experts
5. Emprise Partners LLC
6. Sanford 7 Enterprise LLC

; and

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2026, a Selection Committee comprised of in-house professionals from the Police Department and Department of Design and Construction Management evaluated and ranked the six proposals, in a publicly advertised meeting, based on the following seven evaluation criteria: Firm Qualifications and Experience; Organizational Profile and Project Team Qualifications; Approach to Scope of Work; Knowledge of Site and Local Conditions; References; Location of Firm's Office; Firm's Resources (Equipment & Personnel); and

WHEREAS, the rankings of the firms were as follows, with the highest score being the highest ranked:

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2026, a Notice of Intent to Award was posted and no protests were received; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy Director of DCM recommends that the City Commission approve the final rankings and authorize the appropriate City officials to negotiate and execute an agreement with the highest-ranked firm and, if negotiations fail with the highest-ranked firm, that negotiations take place with the next highest ranked firm, in order, until an agreement is reached, in an amount up to \$300,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the period of performance during which the desired services will be acquired is over an initial term of six months, with two one-month options to renew; and

WHEREAS, funding for this project was included in the amended FY 2026 Capital Improvement Plan and is available in account numbers 334.179901.51900.563010.001190.000.000, and 334.179901.52100.563010.001190.000.000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

Section 2: That it approves the Selection Committee's ranking with All Things Moving & Storage Solutions LLC as the highest ranked firm.

Section 3: That it authorizes the appropriate City officials to negotiate a contract with the highest-ranked firm, All Things Moving & Storage Solutions LLC.

Section 4: That if City officials are unable to negotiate an agreement with the highest-ranked firm, they are authorized to terminate negotiations with that firm and proceed to negotiate and execute an agreement with the next highest-ranked firm(s), in order, until an agreement is reached.

Section 5: That it approves and authorizes the execution, by the appropriate City officials, of an agreement in an amount up to \$300,000.00 with the highest-ranked firm, or another firm should negotiations fail with the highest-ranked firm, together with such non-material changes as may be subsequently agreed to by the City Manager and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney.

Section 6: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
