COMPANY HISTORY

In 1922, Ebsary Foundation Company began as a partnership between Henry L. Ebsary and a man named Mr. Comer, who was believed to be a Key West Marine Contractor. The first job the Comer-Ebsary Partnership performed was the original City of Miami Docks near the site of today's Bayside Marina and by 1928 the Comer-Ebsary partnership completed the foundation system for the Second Avenue Bridge over the Miami River. 



i. The number of employees of contractors and sub-contractors working on the project;

ii. The number of employees on the project hired directly and hired through a third party;

iii. The wages and benefits of workers on the project by classification; and

iv. Whether those wages are at rates less than those prevailing.

Contractor must maintain sufficient records to substantiate this information upon request.

2. Project Labor Agreements

Contractors may provide a certification that the project includes a project labor agreement, meaning a pre-hire collective bargaining agreement consistent with the section 8(f) of the National Labor Relations Act (29 U.S.C. 158(f)). v. Whether the project has completed a labor agreement.

3. Other Reporting Requirements

Contractors must report whether the project prioritizes local hires and whether the project has a Community Benefit Agreement, with a description of any such agreement, if applicable.
