Art and Culture Center of Hollywood Cultural Arts Programming Scope of Services

Programming activities during the 2017-18 funding period include:

1) Gallery Exhibitions, 1650 Harrison Street

Gallery admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors; members free. Free Gallery Admission Day is offered on the third Sunday of each month along with interactive art-making activities (Free Arts! Family Days). Exhibitions include an opening reception with the artists as well as an educational component such as artists panel/workshop/tour. The exhibition schedule is confirmed as follows:

- **3) Arts Education,** Arts School, 1626 Harrison Street; ArtsPark at Young Circle, 1 Young Circle; Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), 1770 Monroe Street. Free and feebased programs open to children and adults, regardless of ability level. Programs consist of:
 - Arts Aspire: Year-round academic and career development program for high-school and college students ages 14-21. Includes workshops, field trips, internships, and special event and programming support. Sessions for school-year calendar 2017-18 and Summer 2018.
 - Summer Arts Camp (June 11–Aug. 17, 2018): Up to 18 distinct program sessions, 2-to-4 weeks in length, for ages 4-17; includes two theatrical performances by students (ages 8-18) enrolled in Broadway Actors, and 16 gallery and theater presentations by Young Artists, Young Actors campers (ages 6-12) and Littlest Actors/Littlest Artists (ages 4-6).
 - Distance Learning Arts Studio: Up to 15 live broadcasts during the 2017-18 school calendar in which an ACCH instructor provides theme-based arts instruction via an online teleconferencing network that links directly to Broward school classrooms and media centers; plus expansion of broadcasts via web-based technology to entities outside Broward public schools.
 - Stage Kids: Performing arts classes presented weekly for ages 8-14 with a closing-night performance. Fall and winter/spring sessions.

- ARTastic Collaborations: Two 6-week after-school classes in the visual and performing arts for children in grades K-3.
- Student Gallery Exhibitions: Up to 8 monthly shows featuring original artwork by up to 500 students at K-12 schools in Broward and Miami-Dade counties; and Center students.
- Private voice, piano, violin, flute, visual arts, creative writing and guitar lessons, ongoing.
- **4) Theater:** Management of events at the Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center, includes Center programming, rentals to outside organizations, and events presented by Broward County Public Schools and the City of Hollywood.
