

Art and Culture Center/Hollywood Cultural Arts Programming Scope of Services

Programming activities during the 2023-24 funding period include:

1) Gallery Exhibitions, 1650 Harrison Street

Admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors; members free:

Oct. 14, 2023, to Jan. 21, 2024: *South Florida Cultural Consortium*, exhibition of Fellowship Program visual/media artists from Broward, Martin, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Palm Beach counties.

Feb. 3 to April 21, 2024: *Women Photographers International Archive*, a group exhibition of contemporary women artists primarily based in South Florida. Curated by Aldeide Delgado, Galleries 1, 2 and 3

May 4-31, 2024: *Exposed: Annual Exhibition and Fund-raiser*, more 50+ works by artists invited by the Curator to participate. Culminates with a live, closing-night drawing in which every ticket holder goes home with an original artwork from the exhibit. Galleries 2-3 TBD

June 15 to Sept. 29, 2024: *Animals*, family-friendly exhibition of works based on animals domestic, invasive, and otherwise. Galleries 2-3: TBD

Free Arts! Family Days is presented from noon-4 p.m. on the third Sunday of every month, providing free admission to the galleries with a thematic art-making activity.

Gallery Events: Receptions, art-making events, and talks/workshops with exhibiting artists and/or guest curators.

The Center shall provide for distribution by the City 3,000 ticket vouchers which are valid for admittance to any general admission event located at The Center's Downtown Hollywood location, 1650 Harrison Street, excluding private and fundraiser events.

2) Film Screenings

Film Screenings: Live or virtual screenings/talks with partnering entities of the Center's *Open Dialogues* documentary film shorts that focus on equity and inclusion for Broward County's LGBTQ and Black communities: *Queer Allies* ((2023), *Gen QueerZ* (2023), *Black Voices | Black Stories* (2022), and *Stories From the LGBTQ Community* (2020).

3) Education for youth ages 5-25 in the visual/performing arts

Arts School, 1626 Harrison Street; ArtsPark at Young Circle, 1 Young Circle; Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), 1770 Monroe Street. Free and fee-based programs open to children and adults, regardless of ability level.

Summer Arts Camp: Sessions, 2-to-4 week sessions for students enrolled in Broadway Actors (ages 9-16), Young Actors, Young Artists (7-10) and Artistic Adventurers (5-6). June 17 to Aug. 16, 2024.

Arts Aspire: Leadership and career development program for ages 14-25, featuring workshops, paid stipends, guest mentors, and program support activities focused on the arts. Enrollment levels for Arts Ambassadors (ages 14-18) and Arts Apprentices (18-25).

Distance Learning Studio: Live teleconference broadcasts delivered via Microsoft Teams to Broward K-12 school classrooms and media centers.

Early Voices Collaborative Exhibitions: Hands-on, inquiry-based, integrated lesson plans presented to educators and children in early-learning centers and K-5 schools; concluding with two unique exhibitions of thematic artworks in the Community Gallery.

Community Gallery: Exhibitions of K-12 schools and community art groups in second-floor space at Main Gallery facility, 1650 Harrison Street.

Stage Kids and ENCORE: After-school sessions in the performing arts for youth ages 8-18, culminating with a closing-night performance. Fall and winter/spring sessions.

Art-Making for Me & My Mini: A new parent and me visual arts class, tailored for parents and children ages 3-7. This engaging class explores the profound connection between art and emotions.

Inventive Artists: After-school weekly sessions in which kid creators ages 8-10 merge artistry with engineering.

Introduction to Art: A new visual arts class for ages 16+ to learn the basics of drawing and painting, culminating in an exhibition in our Community Gallery.

Improv Essentials for Adults: A new adult education program (ages 21+) where participants embrace the witty world of improvisational theater in a fun, safe, and supportive environment.

Private voice, instruments, and art lessons, ongoing.

4) Performing Arts: The Center manages the Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), at 1770 Monroe Street, on a contract basis for the City of Hollywood. Summer Arts Camp and Stage Kids utilize the theater for about 70+ unique class dates or performances. HCPAC hosts up to 100 distinct events presented by outside arts/community entities who rent the theater through the Center; and approximately 30 school events or activities attended K-8 students.
