## PROGRAM INFORMATION

**1. How does your proposed project address the LETF Category (see above) as well as the Hollywood Police Department's Priority Area?**

Hollywood PAL offers a protected, substance-free environment for children in the community, fostering activities that nurture positive interactions with law enforcement. Our comprehensive range of physical fitness programs includes soccer, boxing, cheerleading, weight training, basketball, and youth football. We focus on instilling teamwork values, boosting self-confidence, and offering children meaningful activities that keep them engaged and away from street influences.

**2. Why is this funding needed (What community problem does it address)? What data suggests this program should be implemented with this population or in this geographical location?**

The Hollywood Police Athletic League primarily supports at-risk, single-parent families in our community by offering activities designed to prevent children from engaging in risky behaviors. By involving these children in diverse programs, we aim to bolster their academic success. With the generous donation of 12 laptop computers, we provide after-school tutoring sessions and cultivate college-preparatory skills. Consequently, participants in our tutoring program have demonstrated significant academic improvement, with many earning a place on the school honor roll.

Hollywood PAL offers diverse programs designed to empower and inspire our youth. Our initiatives include the Police Explorer Program, where young individuals gain insights into law enforcement careers, and youth tutoring to support academic success. Additionally, we offer tackle football, cheerleading, and boxing for those passionate about sports, along with soccer to foster teamwork and physical fitness. Our youth mentoring program further provides guidance and positive role models.

During summer, Hollywood Police School Resource Officers manage the facility, hosting a Gang Resistance Education and Training Summer Camp and a Police Explorer Summer Camp. These initiatives strengthen bonds between officers and young people. Hollywood PAL offers a safe, drug-free environment for all participants. The Law Enforcement Trust Fund's generous contributions are essential for PAL's operations, funding youth equipment, supporting summer camps, and maintaining our state-of-the-art facility for community enjoyment.

The Hollywood Police Athletic League (PAL) plays a vital role in supporting the community's youth by offering a safe and nurturing environment. Through a variety of programs and activities, PAL fosters positive relationships between law enforcement officers and young people, building trust and understanding.

Hollywood PAL offers mentorship opportunities, allowing young individuals to benefit from the guidance of law enforcement officers. Since its founding over thirty years ago, Hollywood PAL has been a key player in promoting interactions between the police and the community in South-Central Hollywood. It warmly invites youth from the neighboring City of Dania Beach to participate in its programs, ensuring a secure, drug-free environment under the supervision of responsible adults for children aged 5 to 18.

The Hollywood PAL has consistently demonstrated its commitment and effectiveness in serving the community, backed by a dedicated team of professionals and volunteers who have successfully executed and managed various initiatives.


