Explanation:

This Resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to approve and authorize the execution of the attached Interlocal Agreement "ILA" between Broward County, Florida, and the City of Hollywood whereby the parties jointly agree to expand and extend the City's existing reuse water distribution system to convey additional volumes of water per day for landscape irrigation purposes in West Hollywood. The proposed ILA requires a 50-50 cost sharing match between the County and the City as part of the Integrated Water Resource Plan, "IWRP". The City's required match is estimated to be \$132,000.00 with the County matching a similar amount for the expansion and extension of the of the reuse distribution system.

It also authorizes the Department of Financial Services to create certain accounts to recognize revenue and appropriate program funding and approves and authorizes the expenditure of the required matching funds as described in the attached "Exhibit 1" for the purpose of this grant.

On September 28, 2016 the City Commission approved Resolution Number R-2016-285 which approved the Fiscal Year 2017 Capital Improvement Plan and included funding in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 for Reuse System Infrastructure Expansion and these funds are available for the required 50% cash match provision of Broward County Integrated Water Resource Plan.
