SUBJECT: Proposed Blanket Purchase Orders renewing Agreement with 2 vendors for Emergency Debris Removal from limited spaces and gated communities: 1) Ceres Environmental Services, Inc., and 2) Crowder Gulf Joint Venture, Inc.,

I have discussed the above Agreement with the participating Department/Office, and the proposed general business terms and other significant provisions are as follows:

- 1) Department/Division involved – Public Works
- 2) Type of Agreement – Blanket Purchase Orders
- 3) Method of Procurement (RFP, bid, etc.) – RFP No. 4360-13-IS
- 4) Term of Contract
 - a) initial – One year
 - b) renewals (if any) – Four additional one year periods
 - c) who exercises option to renew – Mutual agreement of the parties
- 5) Contract Amount – \$25,000.00 each via this resolution with the ability to increase for a combined amount of \$2,000,000.00 to be used in the event of an emergency declaration (combined total- each vendor is \$1,000,000.00)
- 6) Termination Rights – The City of Hollywood reserves the right to terminate the agreement immediately with or without cause.
- 7) Indemnity/Insurance Requirements – Contractor shall comply with applicable City requirements.
- 8) Scope of Services – Contractor shall provide the following products and services but are not an exhaustive list: 1. Debris clean-up, all types including construction and hazardous tree debris; as well as post-hurricane/tornado/thunderstorms; 2. Fence repairs, including the installation of temporary fencing; 3. Tree trimming, cutting, removal and stump grinding. The contractor shall provide technical guidance and consultation before, during and after the disaster event, shall provide administrative support, on site management staff to work with City Officials and field supervisors, and provide all necessary operators, drivers, laborers along with appropriate vehicles, equipment, fuel, food and water to be self-sustaining, and hand tools to ensure a successful recovery operation.
- 9) Other Significant Provisions – Contracts shall provide performance/payment bonds for the total amount of the agreement prior to hurricane season.
