Cultural Arts Programming
Scope of Services

Programming activities during the 2019-20 funding period include:

1) Gallery Exhibitions, 1650 Harrison Street

Gallery admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors; members free. Free gallery admission is offered on the third Sunday of each month as part of Free Arts! Family Days art-making activities. Exhibitions include an opening reception and gallery events featuring exhibiting artists. The schedule is confirmed as follows (additional shows are being scheduled at this time in the Relational Room and Interactive Room galleries:

- Oct. 1, 2019 to Jan. 5, 2020: *Artists Draw Their Studios*, drawings of studio workspaces by 60 local and national artists.
- Oct. 1, 2019 to Oct. 27: Onajide Shabaka: *Floridian Lacunae*, interactive studio workspace in which gallery visitors contribute found objects; Amalie Caputo: *Transferences 2.0*, photographs of more than 1,700 personal objects; *Video Projects: Artists' Work Lives*, films from the collections of Robert Adanto and Girls Club.
- Nov. 9, 2019 to Jan. 5, 2020: Rafael Vargas Bernard: *The Allure of Unfathomable Industry*; and *Informed by Intuition: From the Collection of Mindy and Michael Solomon*.
- Jan. 18 to March 15, 2020: *Drawing on Likeness*, works by Gustavo Prado, Ivelisse Jimenez and Lidija Slavkovic; and Michelle Lisa Polissaint: *ruining love songs*
- Feb. 8 to May 8, 2020: Open Art Dialogues LGBTQ-themed exhibition
- March 28 to May 15, 2020: *Exposed: Annual Exhibition and Fund-raiser*, works by South Florida artists that are won by ticket buyers at a closing-night drawing; and Rosa Garmendi solo exhibition
- May 30 to Aug. 16, 2020: *Time to Play*, family-friendly installation based on games played around the world.
- Sept. 12 to Oct. 25, 2020: *Florida Biennial*, all-media juried exhibition open to Florida artists.

Free admission is provided from noon-4 p.m. on the third Sunday of every month for STEAM-Themed Free Arts! Family Days. Families take part in art-making activities that integrate the creativity of the arts to linear thinking common to STEM subjects – Science, Technology, Engineering, Math.

2) Arts Education, Arts School, 1626 Harrison Street; ArtsPark at Young Circle, 1 Young Circle; Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), 1770 Monroe Street. Free and fee-based programs open to children and adults, regardless of ability level. Programs consist of:

- Arts Aspire: Year-round academic and career development program for high-school and college students ages 14-25. Includes workshops, internships, and special event and programming support. Sessions for school-year calendar 2019-20 and Summer 2020.
- Early Voices Collaborative Exhibition: Thematic artworks created by pre-K children and their educators in early-learning centers to coincide with the NAEYC Week of the Young Child. April 13-May 1, 2020.

- Summer Arts Camp (June 8–Aug. 8, 2020): 16 distinct program sessions, 2-to-4 weeks in length, for ages 4-18; includes two theatrical performances by students (ages 8-18) enrolled in Broadway Actors, and 14 gallery and theater presentations by Young Artists, Young Actors campers (ages 6-12) and Littlest Actors/Littlest Artists (ages 4-6).
- Distance Learning Arts Studio: Live broadcasts during the 2019-20 school calendar in which an ACCH instructor provides theme-based arts instruction via an online teleconferencing network that links directly to early-learning centers and Broward school classrooms.
- Stage Kids and Stage Kids – Encore: Performing arts classes presented weekly for ages 8-14 and 12-18 (Encore) with closing-night performance. Fall and winter/spring sessions. Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center.
- ARTastic Collaborations: Two 8-week after-school classes in the visual and performing arts for children in grades K-3 concluding with exhibitions/performances with Stage Kids participants.
- Student Gallery Exhibitions: Monthly shows featuring original artwork by up to 500 students at K-12 schools in Broward and Miami-Dade counties; Center students; and the Memorial Regional Hospital Rebel's Drop-In Center exhibition, *Easel on Fire*.
- Private voice, piano, violin, flute, visual arts, creative writing and guitar lessons, ongoing.

3) Theatre: Management of events at the Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center, includes Center programming, rentals to outside organizations, and events presented by Broward County Public Schools and the City of Hollywood.
