Explanation:

This Resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to execute a preoperational application with Village Youth Services, Inc. to be the Food Service Provider through the State of Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (DACS).for the City of Hollywood Summer Camp program commencing on June 8, 2015 through August 21, 2015 to be held at four (4) sites, and for the Aftercare Program commencing on August 24, 2015 through June 10, 2016 to be held at one (1) site for a one (1) year initial term with three (3) additional one (1) year options to renew.

Per the application, the City of Hollywood acting as Site Sponsor will allow the utilization of City facilities by Village Youth Services, Inc. who will be responsible for furnishing no cost breakfast and lunch to approximately 400-500 low income children at Kay Gaither

Community Center at Beverly Park (KGCC), Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center, McNicol Community Center and Washington Park Community Center during the Summer Camp program. An additional 70-75 low income children will be served a daily snack and dinner at KGCC during the Aftercare program.

This Food Service Program is available at no cost to the participants or to the citizens of Hollywood, as direct reimbursement will be made by DACS to Village Youth for each meal and snack provided.
