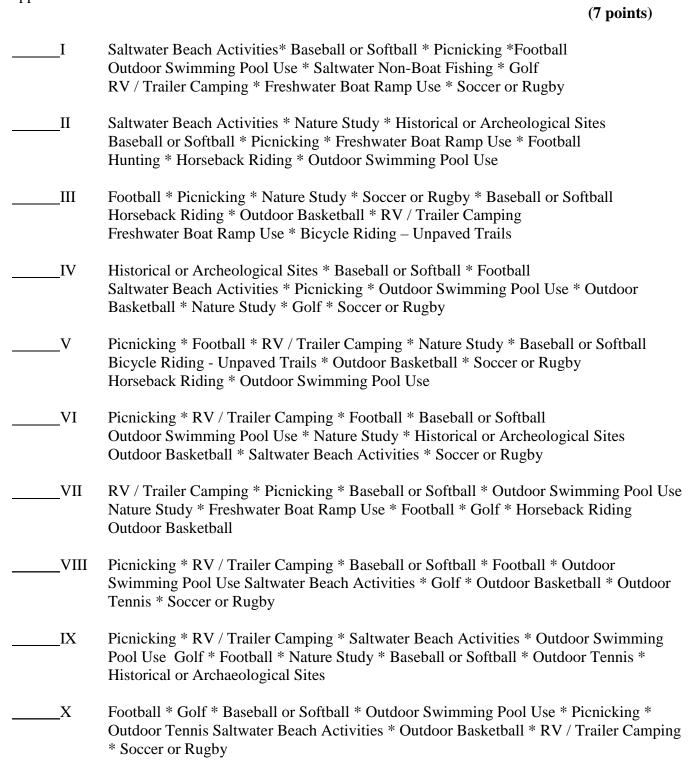

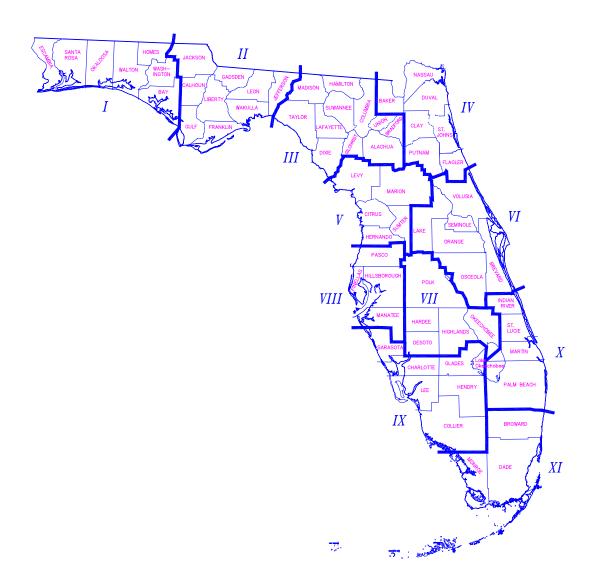

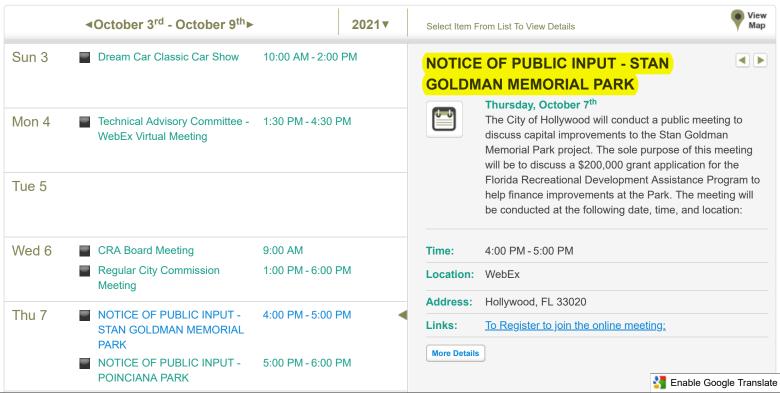

The primary focus of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts (PRCA) is to assess, develop, program, and maintain City parks and facilities. PRCA also plans, coordinates, and implements a multitude of programs and events. The Department's philosophy is reflected in its mission statement – "To enrich the quality of life for our residents and guests through memorable recreational experiences."

PRCA is comprised of four Divisions: Parks & Athletics, Recreation & Aquatics, Cultural Arts and Administration. Other important focus areas within these divisions are Golf, Marina, Artspark, Capital Projects and Grants Management.

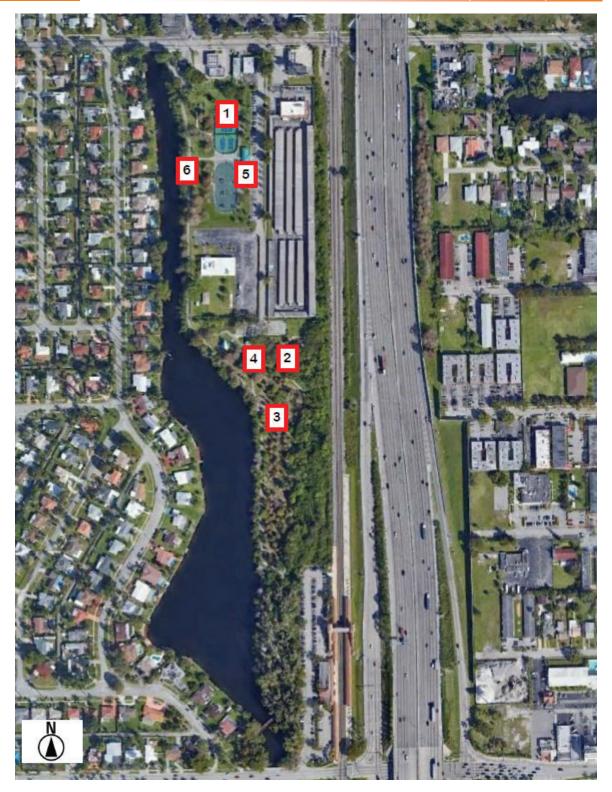
Departmental staff consists of 43 full-time positions. Several of our staff are certified through the Florida Recreation and Parks Association and hold degrees in Parks, Recreation, Physical Education, Public Administration, or other related fields. The City has the personnel and resources needed to maintain Stan Goldman Park

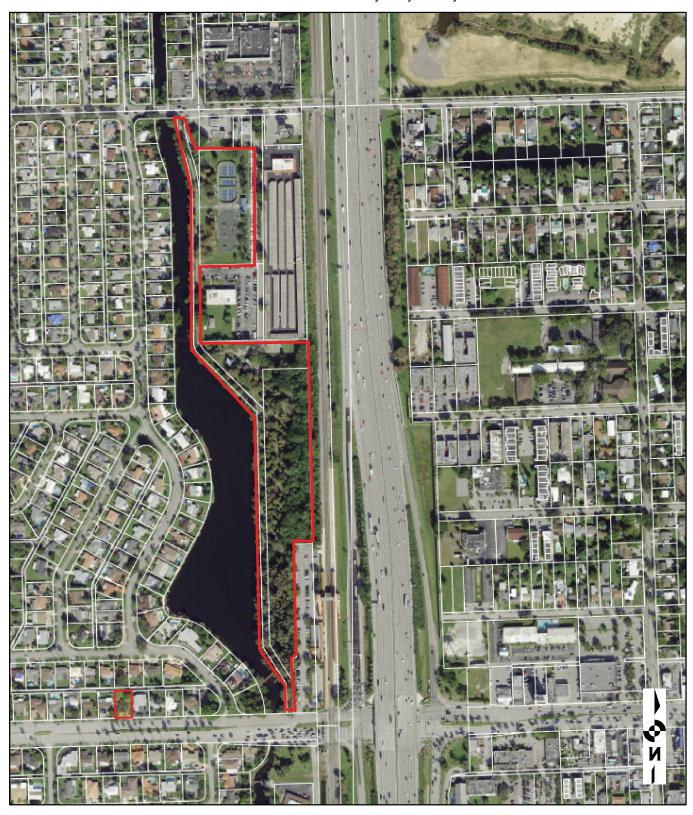

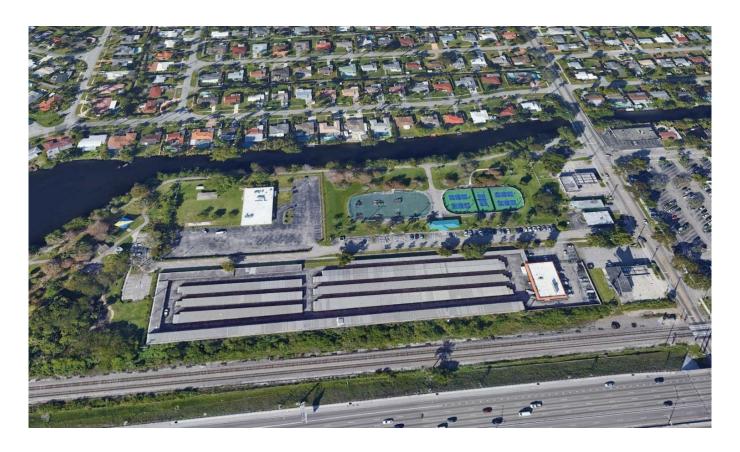








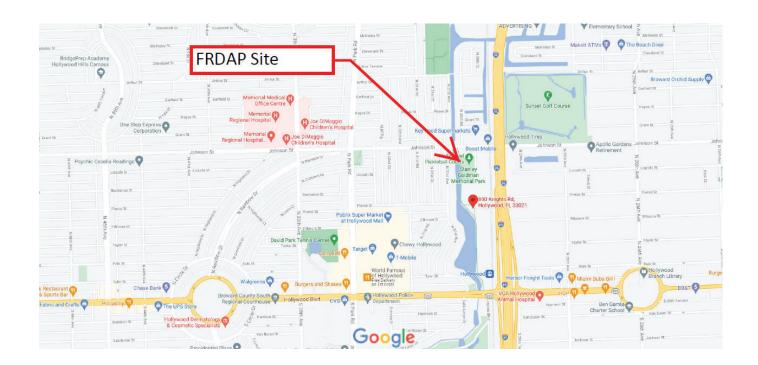

FRDAP Project Description

The residents of Hollywood have demonstrated their support to improve infrastructure throughout the community including the City's park system. In 2019 the residents voted and approved a general obligation bond totaling 165 million dollars. With the ability to borrow the money, the City set out on an ambitious capital improvement initiative identifying drainage, roads and park projects in which to use the funding on. One of the primary recreation projects identified was Stan Goldman Memorial Park.

Situated on the western side of Interstate 95, Stan Goldman is a roughly 12-acre park located at 800 Knights Road. The park is bordered by Johnson Street on the north, Hollywood Boulevard on the South, C-10 canal on the west, and the Tri-rail on the east. There is a foot bridge on the southwest corner of the park connecting to Lions Park. The park consists of Pickleball courts, a skate park, a playground, Hollywoof Dog Park, two restrooms, trails, picnic facilities and a small fishing area.

Since 2019 the City had completed minor improvements to the site but has now begun planning for major renovation project. The FRDAP funding will be used to assist the City with adding new pickleball courts and picnic facility. A new lighted 10 ft. asphalt trail for exercise will be constructed throughout the site. In addition to new facilities, improvements to existing areas will consist of renovating the dog park to provide more area not prone to weather conditions and increase safety. To further promote the outdoor opportunities at the park the project will provide users with renovated restrooms and additional landscaping within the property and at entrance ways.

The City Council In addition to the City's Commission's support for the project through its inclusion in the CIP, the Department presented the project to the Park East Civic Association which after hearing the details and the grant applications included their support for the effort.
