A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE HOLLYWOOD COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CRA) FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THE CRA IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000.00 FOR WORK ASSOCIATED WITH THE CRA'S COASTAL RESILIENCY PHASE IV EAST-WEST STREETS PROJECT FROM HARRISON STREET TO MAGNOLIA TERRACE AND FROM STATE ROAD A1A TO THE BROADWALK.

WHEREAS, the Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA") has identified the Coastal Resiliency Phase IV East-West Streets Project from Harrison Street to Magnolia Terrace between State Road A1A and the Broadwalk ("Project") as a Capital Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the CRA Board approved the Capital Improvement Plan in September 2020 which included the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Project will include but is not limited to the following:

- Improving the existing drainage system and adjusting the profile of the E/W streets to mitigate flooding
- Harmonizing the public right-of-way and private property to reduce flooding
- Ensuring safety and safe conditions through infrastructure improvements
- Reducing runoff by increasing pervious areas
- Creating a safe and resilient environment which stimulates commercial redevelopment and revitalization
- Upgrading the level of service, accessibility and quality of life for residents and visitors

; and

WHEREAS, the Project improvements will mitigate flooding along the local street connectors, improve sunny day flooding by raising the east west streets, and harmonize and create safe access to and from State Road A1A, Florida Department of Transportation Right-Of-Way; and

WHEREAS, the Project was identified within the 1997 Hollywood Beach Community Redevelopment Plan as it promotes redevelopment and eliminates the causes of physical and economic blight; and

WHEREAS, the City, on behalf of the CRA, applied for a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Community Project Funding Program Grant in the total aggregate amount not to exceed \$500,000.00; and

WHEREAS, on February 13, 2025, HUD awarded the City a grant for the Project in the amount of \$500,000.00; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2025, a FY 2024 Community Project Funding Grant Agreement was executed by HUD and the City, attached as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, on June 18, 2025, the City Commission passed and adopted Resolution No. R-2025-422 ratifying the submission of an application to the HUD Community Project Grant Program for the Project, in an amount up to \$500,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Assistant City Manager and the CRA Executive Director recommend that the City Commission authorize the appropriate City officials to execute an Interlocal Agreement, attached as Exhibit "B", with the CRA for payment to the CRA of the federal grant reimbursement awarded to the City for the construction costs paid by the CRA to implement the scope associated with the Project in an amount up to \$500,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

Section 2: That it approves and authorizes the execution, by the appropriate City officials, of the attached Interlocal Agreement with the CRA, together with such non-material changes as may be subsequently agreed to by the City Manager and approved as to form by the Interim City Attorney.

Section 3: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
