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Wastewater Treatment Plant for the Department of Public Utilities in the lump sum amount of \$299,460.00.

Black & Veatch Corporation and the City of Hollywood have a Professional Services Agreement for General Engineering Consulting Services for Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Treatment Plant projects, and this agreement was adopted by the City Commission via Resolution R-2017-283 on September 20, 2017.
