A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO ISSUE THE ATTACHED BLANKET PURCHASE ORDERS WITH CERES ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., DRC EMERGENCY SERVICES, LLC., AND BERGERON EMERGENCY SERVICES, INC., FOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND RECOVERY SERVICES IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY, FOR A COMBINED ANNUAL TOTAL OF \$3,000,000.00.

## **Explanation:**

This resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to issue the attached Blanket Purchase Orders (BPO) to establish pre-need, pre-position contracts for Emergency Response and Recovery Services to assist in a variety of disaster related services in the event of an emergency. The City's current agreements are set to expire in July, 2018.

On May 9, 2018, the City advertised RFP-4592-18-PB online via BidSync and six proposals were received: AshBritt Inc., Bergeron Emergency Services, Inc., Black Diamond Emergency Services, LLC, Ceres Environmental, Custom Tree Care Inc., and DRC Emergency Services.

It is the recommendation of the evaluation committee to issue the attached Blanket Purchase Orders to the top three scoring vendors; Ceres Environmental (B003162), DRC Emergency Services (B003163), and Bergeron Emergency Services (B003164) to Page 2 BIS 18-225 File: TMP-2018-381

support the City's emergency response and recovery effort as applicable during an emergency for an initial two year term of July 23, 2018 through July 22, 2020 with the option to renew for three additional one year terms.

The cumulative amount for all three vendor blanket purchase orders is \$6,000,000.00 with an annual estimated amount for each vendor being \$1,000,000.00 (total 2 year contract amount for each vendor \$2,000,000.00).

Upon the declaration of an emergency event, qualifying expenditures pursuant to the above referenced agreements will be chargeable to the Emergency/Disaster Relief Fund (68) in the current fiscal year and will continue to be chargeable to the Emergency/Disaster Relief Fund (68) in the following fiscal years with reimbursement for these qualifying expenditures to be provided by other governmental resources including federal and state sources.

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
