Explanation:

This Resolution seeks authorization permitting the appropriate City Officials to declare the City's official intent, under applicable regulations of the United States Treasury, with respect to the reimbursement of City funds from proceeds of the state revolving loan fund where said City funds were used to make payments by the City for costs associated with certain capital improvement projects, as temporary advances, made prior to the debt financing.

United States Treasury regulations at §1.150-2, known as the Reimbursement Regulations, prescribe conditions under which proceeds of the state revolving loan fund used to reimburse advances made for capital and certain other expenditures (known as "original expenditures") paid before the date of the debt financing will be deemed to be expended (or properly allocated to expenditures) for purposes of §§103 and 141-150 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, so that the proceeds so used will no

longer be subject to the requirements or restrictions under the above-cited sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Reimbursement Regulations require a Declaration of Official Intent for the use of debt proceeds as reimbursement to the City no later than sixty (60) days following payment of the Original Expenditures expected to be reimburse from the state revolving loan fund proceeds. Furthermore, the reimbursement must occur within a certain prescribed time period after an Original Expenditure is paid or after the property resulting from the Original Expenditure is placed into service.

The amount of the state revolving loan fund proceeds to be raised from which reimbursement will be made for the costs of the above referenced capital improvement projects is \$20,112,000.00.
