#### **Explanation:**

This Resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to authorize the City Attorney to pursue legal actions against violators who have breached their agreement with the City of Hollywood in reference to the Hollywood Marina.

The Hollywood Marina Dockmaster currently has several vessel owners who have breached their dockage agreements and in order to institute the appropriate civil action, including but not limited to in rem and in personam actions pursuant to state and federal law and in conjunction with the United States Marshal, if required, the City Attorney must have the authorization of the City Commission as per Section 7.02(b)(4) of the City Charter. The Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts has requested that the City Attorney's Office pursue recovery of the delinquent fees as well as possibly obtaining ownership of the vessels.

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
