- 2. Reduce Part 1 crimes through the continued application of mobile technology to provide and gather real time intelligence for use by Detectives and Officers in the field.

- 1. Provide simulated tactical and de-escalation training through the use of interactive scenario based technology.
- 2. Quickly identify individuals and verify personal information.
- 3. Rapid gathering of intelligence information by officers/detectives in the field for data sharing with crime analysts and investigators.
- 4. Complete police and traffic crash reports in a mobile field environment.
- 5. Print search/arrest warrants, affidavits, and wanted/missing person flyers electronically from the field.
- 6. Remotely track and follow-up on case management.
- 7. Increase effectiveness and efficiency of officers/detectives in the field.

PROJECT ABSTRACT:

The Hollywood Police Department focuses on data-driven, proactive policing strategies which utilize technology driven Public Safety efforts. As such, the Hollywood Police Department has utilized prior year BYRNE - JAG grant funding to increase the Department's technological capabilities in the field which has led to substantial reductions to a variety of Uniform Crime Reporting Part

1 crimes. In continuing with this focus, the Hollywood Police Department is requesting the use of its 2017 BYRNE - Justice Assistance Grant funds distributed via the Broward County Sheriff's Office to purchase Law Enforcement Technology in the amount of \$46,484.14. The Department will utilize this grant funding to purchase training simulator equipment/software upgrades, a compact wet/dry Livescan ten-print scanner, 36 Brother Mobile Thermal printers and 20 MagTek Swipe magnetic card readers. While this funding globally enhances a number of the Department's technology driven efforts, it also helps to address BJA focus areas of Officer Safety/Wellness and Border Security. Technology deployed to the field provides real time data to Officers and Detectives, and may additionally be utilized by Crime Analysts to extract crime information developed through data analytics.

PROJECT NARRATIVE:

The City of Hollywood Police Department utilizes intelligence led and problem solving initiatives as a bedrock of its community oriented policing strategies. The Department's Crime Analysts utilize geospatial and temporal data analytics to effectively allow the Department to practice predictive policing while addressing the majority of Uniform Crime Reporting Part 1 crimes. During previous JAG grant cycles, the Department utilized this funding source to establish technology platforms which allow Officers/Detectives to remotely access information and reporting systems from the field thereby increasing their effectiveness and efficiency while conducting criminal investigations, criminal intelligence gathering and case management.

The Department utilizes data-driven proactive policing strategies which emphasize offender intervention along with crime and disorder hot spot intervention to effectively deploy its resources to address crime trends and community concerns. As a result, the City of Hollywood realized an overall reduction of 5% in Part 1 crime for 2016.

However, while the department remains committed to addressing the needs of our external clients, it also realizes the importance of providing the proper training and tools to the personnel that serve them daily. Therefore, officer safety and wellness remain a high priority. Use of Force, particularly in critical incidents, has become a hot button issue nationally in the aftermath of several high profile police involved shooting incidents. Therefore, a portion of the 2017 Bryne JAG funding received by the Hollywood Police Department will be utilized to upgrade existing interactive scenario based simulation training opportunities with both lethal and less lethal weaponry. However, while tactical training is important, the interactive simulation training also provides for de-escalation situations wherein officers may use verbal techniques to minimize the number of use of force incidents which occur.

The remaining 2017 Byrne JAG funding will be utilized to increase the Department's technological capabilities both internally and in the field. The Livescan fingerprint scanner can integrate with criminal booking, applicant enrollment and background check submission platforms to further enhance information and intelligence gathering. The magnetic card readers and thermal printers will be deployed to officers and detectives in the field to provide mobile

platforms for quickly conducting criminal investigations, gathering criminal intelligence and case management.

While Byrne-JAG funding globally enhances a number of the Department's technology driven efforts, it also helps to address BJA focus areas of Officer Safety/Wellness and Border Security.

Officer safety and wellness remain a high priority for the Department. Use of Force, particularly in critical incidents, has become a hot button issue nationally in the aftermath of several high profile police involved shooting incidents. Therefore, the Hollywood Police Department will utilize an estimated \$19,450.00 of 2017 Bryne JAG funding received to upgrade existing interactive scenario based simulation training opportunities with both lethal and less lethal weaponry. The interactive simulation training also provides for de-escalation situations wherein officers may use verbal techniques to minimize the number of use of force incidents which occur. The purchase price for this item includes hardware, software, equipment and training.

The Department will utilize an estimated \$7,099.00 to purchase a Livescan 10-print fingerprint scanner to digitally record and confirm fingerprints. The Livescan fingerprint scanner can integrate with criminal booking, applicant enrollment and background check submission platforms to further enhance information and intelligence gathering.

E. SUPPLIES

During previous Byrne-JAG grant cycles, the Department utilized grant funding to establish technology platforms which allow officers/detectives to remotely access information and reporting systems from the field thereby increasing their effectiveness and efficiency while conducting criminal investigations, criminal intelligence gathering

and case management. The technology deployed to the field provides real time data which may additionally be utilized by crime analysts to extract crime information developed through data analytics.

Therefore, the Department plans to utilize an estimated \$19,025.00 of 2017 Byrne-JAG funding to purchase Brother Mobile PJ7 thermal printers. Additionally, the Department will utilize an estimated \$910.00 to also purchase MagTek Swipe Magnetic Card Readers.

This mobile technology will be deployed to officers and detectives in the field to provide mobile platforms for quickly conducting criminal investigations, gathering criminal intelligence and case management.
