A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, ENDORSING THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S DELIVERY OF SIDEWALK AND BICYCLE LANE IMPROVEMENTS FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS IDENTIFIED IN THE FIVE-YEAR ADOPTED WORK PROGRAM WHICH FALL WITHIN THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD'S JURISDICTIONAL RIGHT OF WAY, AS MORE SPECIFICALLY KNOWN AS THE 56<sup>th</sup> AVENUE BIKE LANE PROJECT NO. 4346971

WHEREAS, the City Commission supports the completion of missing sidewalk networks and designated bicycle lanes along the City's roadway system to provide safe pedestrian and bicycle pathways to protect residents from the traveling public and provide sustainable alternatives for mobility and transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (Broward MPO) obtained federal funding to be appropriated towards mobility enhancement projects; and

WHEREAS, through the Department of Public Work's efforts, the Broward MPO designated full project federal funding towards the 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue Bike Lane Project No. 4346971, providing for the construction of bike lanes along:

- 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Pembroke Road to Stirling Road within varied Hollywood neighborhoods; and
- S 62<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from County Line Road to Johnson Street within the Beverly Park neighborhood.

; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to optimize project implementation and provide cost and time savings, the City, Broward MPO and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) agree that delivery of the two above referenced projects will include the necessary design, construction and project management services which are best provided for by FDOT; and

WHEREAS, the City will continue to maintain the roadway and improvements upon completion of construction which fall within the City jurisdictional right of way; and

CITY ENDORSEMENT FOR FDOT TO IMPLEMENT FEDERALLY FUNDED SIDEWALK INSTALLATIONS ALONG CITY ROADWAY FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the City must endorse FDOT's delivery of projects which fall within the City jurisdictional right of way; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1</u>: That it hereby endorses the Florida Department of Transportation's delivery of sidewalk and bicycle lane improvements for certain projects identified in the five-year adopted work program which fall within the City of Hollywood's jurisdictional right of way, as more specifically known as the 56<sup>th</sup> Avenue Bike Lane Project No. 4346971
