## **Proposed Legislation:**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, RANKING AND APPOINTING TWO (2) SPECIAL MAGISTRATES PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 36 OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD CODE OF ORDINANCES AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE ATTACHED RETAINER AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE TWO (2) HIGHEST RANKED SPECIAL MAGISTRATES AND THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA FOR AN ESTIMATED ANNUAL EXPENDITURE OF \$10,000.00.

## **Explanation:**

This Resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to rank, appoint, and execute Retainer Agreements between the two (2) highest ranked special magistrates to hold hearings and assess fines against violators of the respective municipal codes and ordinances for an initial term commencing on October 15, 2017 and ending on October 14, 2020 with the City's option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year terms, at an estimated annual expenditure not to exceed \$10,000.

Chapter 162, Florida Statutes, provides authority for a municipality to adopt Special Magistrates to hold hearings and assess fines against violators of the respective

municipal codes and ordinances, and Chapter 36, City of Hollywood Code of Ordinances provides authority for the City Commission to appoint Special Magistrates.
