Proposed Legislation:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING AND ADOPTING THE BROWARD COUNTY DECEMBER 2017 UPDATE OF THE MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ENHANCED LOCAL MITIGATION STRATEGY (ELMS) PLAN PURSUANT TO THE DISASTER MITIGATION ACT OF 2000 WHICH ESTABLISHES CRITERIA FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR LOCAL DISASTER-RELATED MITIGATION PROJECTS; AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CERTAIN ACCOUNTS TO RECOGNIZE AND APPROPRIATE SAID FEDERAL FUNDS, IF AND WHEN DISTRIBUTED; AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE ANY AND ALL APPLICABLE PARTICIPATION AGREEMENTS TO RECEIVE SAID FUNDS.

Explanation:

This Resolution seeks authorization for the appropriate City Officials to approve, support and adopt the updated multi-jurisdictional Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy (ELMS) plan pursuant to the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000. The adoption of this Resolution will ensure the City remains eligible for disaster mitigation grant funding if a disaster is officially declared. It also authorizes the appropriate City Officials to accept and execute any agreements necessary for participation.

The City of Hollywood is a member of the Broward County Emergency Coordinating Council which was established to provide a comprehensive strategy in emergency preparedness for all the municipalities in Broward County. The State of Florida has designated Broward County Emergency Management as the coordinator of the local hazard mitigation plan and the City Commission adopted Resolution R-2000-384 on November 1, 2000 approving Broward County's plan. Broward County entered into an agreement with Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) for the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program in support of an enhanced mitigation plan on April 26, 2016 and on October 18, 2017 FDEM approved the proposal. Broward County adopted the updated multi-jurisdictional ELMS plan on December 12, 2017.

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
