A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. R-2018-137 TO REVISE THE GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 FLORIDA INLAND NAVIGATION DISTRICT DERELICT VESSEL REMOVAL PROGRAM GRANT TO DECREASE THE GRANT REQUEST FROM \$13,750.00 TO \$6,875.00, AND INCREASING THE REQUIRED MATCHING FUNDS FROM \$13,750.00 TO \$20,625.00, WHICH WILL BE PROVIDED THROUGH THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION DERELICT VESSEL REMOVAL PROGRAM GRANT FUNDING; AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO ACCEPT SAID GRANT IF AWARDED; AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CERTAIN ACCOUNTS TO RECOGNIZE AND APPROPRIATE THE GRANT FUNDING; AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 ADOPTED OPERATING BUDGET (R-2017-288) OF THE POLICE GRANTS FUND (FUND 13) AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE AND EXECUTION OF THE GRANT UPON AWARD.

WHEREAS, on May 2, 2018, the City Commission approved R-2018-137, authorizing the Florida Inland Navigation District ("FIND") grant application in the approximate amount of \$13,750.00, along with \$13,750.00 in matching funds, which were to come from another grant considered contemporaneously; and

WHEREAS, FIND initiated this grant program to assist with the removal and proper disposal of derelict vessels from waterways; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department, upon City Commission approval, submitted a proposal to the FIND Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant; and

WHEREAS, additional funding has become available and the Police Department wishes to amend the amount in the grant application; and

WHEREAS, FIND Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant funds will be decreased from approximately \$13,750.00 to approximately \$6,875.00, along with an increase in the matching funds from \$13,750.00 to \$20,625.00 in matching funds, which will come from another grant considered contemporaneously; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, grant funds for the award period FY 2018, in the amount of \$6,875.00 together with \$20,625.00 in matching funds from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation ("FWC") Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant will be used for the removal and disposal of derelict vessels located in the waterways of the City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution R-2017-288, adopted and approved by the City Commission on September 27, 2017, the Fiscal Year 2018 Adopted Budgets for various City funds were first adopted and approved where operating revenues were recognized, available funding was appropriated for approved expenditures and budgetary adjustments and transfers were authorized; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution seeks to authorize the recognition of potentially new grant funds and the appropriation of said funds for expenditures, if awarded, related to the FIND Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant and as detailed further in the attached Exhibit "1"; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police recommends that the City Commission authorize the appropriate City officials to submit an amended application to the FIND Derelict Vessel Removal Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

Section 2: That it approves and authorizes the appropriate City officials to submit an amended application to the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) for the FIND Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant.

Section 3: That the City Manager is authorized to accept the grant, if awarded; provided, however, that the City Manager shall have the discretion to refuse the grant in those circumstances where he determines it is in the best interest of the City to do so, in which case he shall advise the City Commission of his intention to refuse the grant.

Section 4: That upon the FY 2018 Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Derelict Vessel Removal Program Grant being awarded to the City, it authorizes the appropriate City officials to accept the award and execute the grant agreement and any and all applicable grant documents in a form acceptable to the City Manager and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney.

Section 5: That the Department of Financial Services is authorized to create and establish in the appropriate fund, the Police Grants Fund (Fund 13), all necessary accounts to recognize the receipt of grant funding, if awarded, and to appropriate grant funding for grant related expenditures as may be required.

Section 6: That the Amendments, Adjustments and Transfers to the Operating Budget of the City of Hollywood for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2017, relating to the Police Grants Fund (Fund 13), as further detailed in the attached Exhibit "1" are approved, adopted and accepted as Amendments to the Operating Budget of the City of Hollywood, Florida for Fiscal Year 2018.

Section 7: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
