

FY 2018 Accomplishments



Phase III East/West Streetscape - Oklahoma to New Mexico Streets: \$13.9M

- Construction completed on the east/west streetscape of 15 streets between SR A1A and Surf Road
- Construction underway on Liberty and Scott Streets and all street-ends







Nebraska/Nevada Street Parking Garage: \$13.1M

- 303 space public parking garage
- Demolition has been completed
- Construction underway of piles and grade beams







Beach Renourishment Project: \$3.4 M (Direct Construction Cost)

- Second phase of Beach Renourishment Project was completed
- The project is being monitored for 3 years as required by the permit







Sage Project: \$3.5M (Pursuant to development agreement and legal settlement)

- Streetscape and street-ends completed at Iris and Jasmine Terraces from SR A1A to Surf Road
- Project substantially complete
 - Removal of wooden light poles
 - Addressing punch list items







SR A1A from Arizona to Sheridan Street - \$2.9M CRA Contribution (portion of FDOT's \$9.4M project)

- CRA Contribution of \$2.9M approved for FDOT/CRA RRR Project (resurfacing, rehabilitation, restoration)
- Project started October 2017
 - CRA complete streets streetscape portion includes enhanced landscape, pedestrian lighting, undergrounding of utility lines, and a new traffic signal at Garfield Street.
- FDOT is currently working on Phase I milling and resurfacing of asphalt
 - Monroe to Michigan Street section completed
 - Johnson to Sheridan Street section began September 2018
- Concrete work, header curbs, curb and gutter completed on east side of road.
 Grading on sidewalk fill completed and decorative paver installation started
 September 2018.
- Scheduled completion: Spring 2019













CRA Complete Streets SR A1A from Arizona to Sheridan Street - \$11M

- Complete streetscape includes enhanced landscape, pedestrian lighting, undergrounding of utility lines, and a new traffic signal at Garfield Street.
- Project is currently in design phase
- Project is anticipated to start permitting by January 2019



- Release of bid documents anticipated by Spring 2019
- Construction estimated to start FY 2020
- Estimated Substantial Completion: Summer 2021



First Aid Stations and Lifeguard Towers

- On September 5, 2018, the CRA board approved a contract for the purchase of 6 First Aid Stations and 15 Lifeguard Towers
- The structures are selected from the Heavy Timber Lifeguard Towers catalogue, Manufactured by Post and Beam LLC
- Both the model LX Upgraded Lifeguard Tower and the model X1 Base Lifeguard Tower come with options, are engineered, and installed on the beach

First Aid Stations and Lifeguard Towers

- The First Aid Station has a round roof, a round deck, aluminum railing and iconic signage at a cost of \$109,000.00 per unit.
- The Lifeguard Tower design includes a square cab, square deck and a hip roof, at a cost of \$77,400 per unit.




Approved Lifeguard Tower

- Catalogue purchase cost \$1,815,000 (a cost savings of over \$2 million of the lowest bid pricing). CRA is currently working on issuing a Purchase Order and is anticipated that the project will begin October 5,2018
- Roof and painting are under another contract FY 2019 and are estimated at \$250,000

Anti-Litter / Polystyrene Campaign



- CRA staff worked with COH staff to create an awareness campaign for the Polystyrene ban
 - CRA funded the printing of collateral material
 - Informational brochure
 - Table toppers for restaurants
 - CRA Visitor Services staff and Code Enforcement distributed collateral material to Beach business community




- Launched second phase of anti-litter campaign

Beach Maintenance



Enhanced Services provided

- CRA Beach maintenance shift (1:30pm 9:30pm)
 - 11 staff members (including supervisor)
 - Emptying of trash, recycling bins, and ashtrays
 - Broadwalk, street-ends, side streets, and Charnow Park
 - Pressure cleaning of showers
 - Delittering
 - Broadwalk, street-ends, side streets, Charnow Park, and dunes
 - Special projects
 - Broadwalk wall, light fixtures, removal of sand from Broadwalk, banners, etc.
- Pressure cleaning and sealing of Broadwalk
- Bathroom maintenance upgrade
- Bike lane painting
- Purchase of equipment including two John Deere Gators





Building Permit Review



- Building permits submitted to COH for properties within the CRA districts are reviewed weekly by CRA staff for design and property standards
 - Some are electronic, but most require the review of tangible files in the Building Department
- Permits consist primarily of:
 - Window or door replacement
 - Signage
 - Roofing
 - AC replacements
 - Fencing
- There have been an approximately 25 per week within the past year which equates to an estimated 1,300 permits per year
- Paint permits within the CRA District are also reviewed

Parklets



One-Year Pilot Program

- CRA staff contracted an architect to design a modular Parklet system which can be modified and easily relocated to different locations
- The new Parklet was constructed off site and assembled in July 2018 at 1921 Hollywood Blvd, and will remain at that location until January 31, 2019.
 - This Parklet is designed for diagonal parking spaces.
- A second Parklet was installed at 1906 Harrison Street in September 2018.
 It will also remain in place until January 31, 2019.
 - This Parklet was originally constructed for use on Park(ing) Day in 2015 & 2016;
 it was designed for parallel parking spaces.









Grant Programs



- Four types of reimbursement grant programs available to qualified properties in the districts
 - HIP: Hotel Improvement Program (only on Hollywood Beach)
 - PIP: Property Improvement Program
 - MiniPIP: Mini Property Improvement Program
 - POP: Paint only Program
- Grant Workshops are held twice monthly
 - All applicants are required to attend prior to applying
- Grant funding cannot be used to remedy code violations

Young Circle Roadway Project



Young Circle Roadway Project - \$130K

- In April 2018, Marlin Engineering (ME) collected traffic data as part of the Phase I for the project
- In June 2018, CRA staff met with Young Circle property owners and developers to inform and update them about this project
- Toole Design Group (TDG), ME and CRA staff met with officials from the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)
 - A public meeting was held in June 2018
- CRA staff continues to work with City staff and consultants to develop a methodology to present to FDOT
- Next phase will commence upon approval of FY 2019 budget

Hollywood TOD Station Area Master Plan



Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Grant valued at \$240K

- CRA contribution \$25K
- COH contribution \$15K
- In December 2017, CRA, COH and TCRPC staff organized a Charrette and a Workshop Open-Design Studio to obtain information from the public, developers and property owners
- In February and May 2018, TCRPC presented a Work-In Progress presentation to the CRA Board


