



SUBJECT: Changes for 2nd Reading of PO-2019-22, Revisions to Chapter 72 of the City Code of Ordinances

EXPLANATION:

The Parking Division presented the 1st reading of PO-2019-22, Revisions to Chapter 72 of the City Code of Ordinances on September 18th, 2019. The original 2nd Reading was withdrawn at the Commission meeting of November 20th, 2019 to make requested changes to the revised ordinance. Those changes are presented below.

The 4th "Whereas" clause explains the necessity of having different fine structures for violations at the beach and elsewhere in the City.

§72.001 DEFINITIONS.

Language added to define Beach Residential Parking Permit.

§72.016 PARKING, STANDING IN FREIGHT LOADING ZONE.

Language added to authorize the Parking Administrator to determine necessity and set days and times for loading zones.

§72.026 PARKING PERMIT PROGRAMS.

Language added to Sections (E) and (F) to clarify Residential and Beach Residential permits and programs. Language added to Section (H) adding "legally registered" to ELIGIBLE VEHICLES and limiting numbers of permits per household.

§72.077 OVERTIME PARKING

Sections (A) and (B) define eastern and western boundaries of the City for purposes of overtime parking violation enforcement.

Section (C) clarifies when a parking permit can be used for metered parking.

Section (D) creates separate fine structures for eastern and western parts of the City, similar to on-street parking fees.

§72.078 TRUCKS, TRACTOR TRAILERS, SEMI-TRAILERS AND TRAILERS.

Trucks, tractor trailers, semi-trailers and trailers are better defined, using definitions in Florida State Statutes. Also, section will only be enforced in areas posted with official signs.

§72.111 RESTRICTIONS ON PARKING VEHICLES.

Section (B)(1) adds language concerning unregistered vehicles.

Section (2) changes "shall" to "may".

§72.999 PENALTY.

References to §72.077 and §72.077(B) are struck from Section (E)(1).

RECOMMENDATION:

Acceptance of the recommended changes to the ordinance.
