A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH SINNOTT WOLACH TECHNOLOGY GROUP FOR THE PURCHASE OF INFOBLOX NETWORK APPLIANCES. TRAINING, AND **PROFESSIONAL** SERVICES AND THREE YEARS OF MAINTENANCE AND SOFTWARE SUBSCRIPTIONS FOR AN ESTIMATED AMOUNT OF \$210,000.00, BASED UPON GSA SCHEDULE NO. GS-35F-0119Y AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 38.41(C)(5) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES (PIGGYBACK).

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2015 the City adopted Resolution No. R-2015-286 for the purchase of Infoblox network appliances to provide Domain Name System ("DNS") and Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol ("DHCP") services for the City's networks, both Internal and Wi-Fi; and

WHEREAS, it has been announced by Infoblox that the existing network appliances will be classified end-of-life in February 2021; and

WHEREAS, the attached quote includes replacement network appliances, three years of maintenance, three years of advanced security software subscriptions, training, and professional services to assist in migrating configurations from the City's existing network appliances; and

WHEREAS, the advanced security software subscriptions will enhance the City's security posture by leveraging a DNS firewall using Threat Intelligence provided by partnerships with multiple security firms including the DHS Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency program; integrations with the City's Active Directory DNS, Fortinet, AlienVault, and other security solutions; and analytics and reporting functions; and

WHEREAS, Section 38.41 (C)(5) of the Procurement Ordinance allows the Director to procure, without following formal procedures, all goods and services that are subject of contracts with the state, its political subdivisions, the United States government, other governmental entities, or a corporation not for profit whose members are governmental entities, public officers, or any combination thereof, provided that the goods and services are: (i) the subject of a price schedule negotiated by the state or the United States government, or (ii) the subject of a contract with another governmental entity or a corporation not for profit whose members are governmental entities, public officers, or any combination

thereof, which contract is based strictly on competitive bids or competitive proposals and not on any preference; and

WHEREAS, the Information Technology Department found the most competitive rates with and is seeking to purchase Infoblox products and services from Sinnott Wolach Technology Group via GSA Schedule No. GS-35F-0119Y; and

WHEREAS, funding for this service is available in the FY 2020 Operating Budget account number 557.130101.51900.564410.000000.000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1</u>: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

<u>Section 2</u>: That it approves and authorizes the execution, by the appropriate City officials, of an agreement embodying the terms and conditions approved by the City Commission this date with Sinnott Wolach Technology Group, in a form acceptable to the City Manager and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney.

<u>Section 3</u>: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
