

Art and Culture Center/Hollywood Cultural Arts Programming Scope of Services

Programming activities during the 2020-21 funding period include:

1) Gallery Exhibitions, 1650 Harrison Street

Gallery admission is \$7 for adults, \$4 for students/seniors; members free. Free gallery admission is offered on the third Sunday of each month as part of Free Arts! Family Days art-making activities. Exhibitions include on-site and virtual gallery events featuring exhibiting artists, curators and authors. The schedule is confirmed as follows (additional shows are being scheduled at this time in the Middle and Interactive galleries):

- Oct. 1-25, 2020 (portion of dates): Open Dialogues: Stories From the LGBTQ Community, featuring a 20-minute film documentary of comingout testimonials by seven Broward County residents; and Rosa Naday Garmendia: Not So Far Away, an exploration of the immigrant experience that highlights respect and resilience.
- Nov. 7, 2020-Feb. 21, 2021: 2020 Florida Biennial and Biennial Select. Guest juror: Coralie Claeysen-Gleyzon, Associate Curator for Collections and Exhibitions at the Orlando Museum of Art; plus Biennial Select, two solo exhibitions by artists selected to exhibit in the 2020 Florida Biennial.
- March 6-May 16, 2021: Fractured Landscapes: Cara Despain and Emanuel Tovar, site-specific collaborative exhibition between U.S. and Mexico-based artists. Middle and Interactive galleries TBD
- June 5-August 15, 2021: Artists and Identity: Portraiture, Doppelganger and Disguise, family-friendly group exhibition by national and Florida artists with art-making based on exhibition themes.
- Aug. 28-Sept. 24, 2020: Exposed Exhibition and Fund-raiser, up to 100 artworks donated by artists for an exhibition and closing-night draw by ticket holders of exhibited works. Middle and Interactive galleries TBD.

STEAM-Themed Free Arts! Family Days is provided from noon-4 p.m. on the third Sunday of every month. In addition to free admission to the galleries, families also take part in art-making activities that integrate the creativity of the arts to linear thinking common to STEM subjects – Science, Technology, Engineering, Math. Free Arts! activities are video recorded and made available at the Center's website for those who want to create their artwork at home.

2) Arts Education, Arts School, 1626 Harrison Street; ArtsPark at Young Circle, 1 Young Circle; Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center (HCPAC), 1770 Monroe Street. Free and fee-based programs open to children and adults, regardless of ability level.

Education programming for youth ages 4-18 consists of year-round instruction in the visual/performing arts. At this time, in keeping with social distancing and capacity limits on facilities imposed by Covid-19 restrictions, the Center is developing a hybrid model that would include on-site art-making classes limited to groups of eight students, as well as remote learning presented by instructors from our Distance Learning Arts Studio. Programs will be adapted where possible, with the intention to return to on-site programming as early as spring 2021. Programs consist of:

- Arts Aspire: Year-round academic and career development program for ages 14-25. Includes in-person and Zoom-based workshops, mentoring activities, internships, and special event and programming support. Sessions for schoolyear calendar 2020-21 and Summer 2021.
- Distance Learning Arts Studio: Live broadcasts during the 2020-21 school calendar in which an ACCH instructor provides theme-based arts instruction via an online teleconferencing network that links directly to early-learning centers and Broward Schools classrooms.
- Early Voices Collaborative Exhibition: Thematic artworks created by pre-K children and their educators in early-learning centers to coincide with the NAEYC Week of the Young Child. Spring 2021.
- Summer Arts Camp (June 7–Aug. 13, 2021): 16 distinct program sessions, 2-to-4 weeks in length, for ages 4-18; includes two theatrical performances by students (ages 8-18) enrolled in Broadway Actors, and 14 gallery and theater presentations by Young Artists, Young Actors campers (ages 6-12) and Littlest Actors/Littlest Artists (ages 4-6).
- Small-group after-school classes in the visual and performing arts for ages 6-18. TBD (Oct. 2020-May 2021).
- Community Gallery: Monthly exhibitions featuring original artwork by students at K-12 schools in Broward and Miami-Dade counties; Center arts-education students; and the Memorial Regional Hospital Rebel's Drop-In Center exhibition, Easel on Fire.
- Private voice, art and piano lessons, ongoing.
- **3) Theatre:** Management of all events at the Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center, 1770 Monroe Street, includes Center programming, rentals to outside arts/community organizations, and events presented by Broward County Public Schools and the City of Hollywood.
