### Issue:

The City if Hollywood Commission was presented with the Dune Master Plan, however, it has not been officially adopted yet.

### **Explanation:**

On July 21<sup>st</sup>, the Sustainability Advisory Committee had a presentation from Lee Gottlieb, the chair of the Dune Master Plan Task Force, on the Dune Master Plan and the importance of the City adopting and beginning implementation of the Plan as soon as possible.

Dunes are known to provide valuable protection to upland properties and infrastructure by serving as a buffer from storm damage and flooding caused by coastal waves and elevated sea levels. They prevent beach erosion and provide critical habitat for sea turtle reproduction.

The Sustainability Advisory Committee unanimously passed a motion to send a letter of support to the City Commission.

#### **Recommendation:**

Your Sustainability Advisory Committee hereby expresses its strong support for approval and implementation of the Dune Master Plan as proposed by the City CRA.

# A UNANIMOUS RESOLUTION OF THE HOLLYWOOD SUSTAINABILITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, reducing the use of polystyrene foam products and single-use plastics will protect the public, health, and safety of the City of Hollywood's residents, as well as its natural environment, beaches, waterways, and wildlife;

WHEREAS, many local businesses had successfully replaced polystyrene foam and single-use plastics in their homes and business operations with environmentallyfriendly products prior to the current public health emergency related to the virus COVID-19;

WHEREAS, as local businesses reopen and residents return to these businesses, local businesses and residents should be encouraged to continue the use of environmentally-friendly products in accordance with the CDC guidelines and the advice of local and state health officials;

WHEREAS, the Committee believes the sharing of this type of information with the public through directed announcements is necessary for the pursuit of sustainability goals in the City of Hollywood even during this public health emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sustainability Advisory Committee recommends the City of Hollywood include sustainability elements in relevant communications to its residents and businesses relating to COVID-19.



Letter of Support for the Dune Master Plan as Proposed by the City CRA

Dear Mayor Levy and Commissioners:
