Explanation:

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts advertised a Call to Artist to design and install a mural on the east facing exterior wall of the Dr. Martin L. King Jr. Community Center.

The City's Art Selection Committee evaluated the five proposals and compiled a short list of three qualified artists based on the Call to Artist Dr. Martin L. King Jr. Community Center Mural Project Evaluation Criteria.

The artists provided mock-up mural designs that were presented to the Liberia Community and ranked during the monthly Liberia Civic Association meeting.

After evaluation, PRCA recommends that the City Commission approve the artists rankings.
