A Resolution Of The City Commission Of The City Of Hollywood, Florida, Authorizing The Appropriate City Officials To Issue The Attached Blanket Purchase Order Agreement Between Allied Universal Corporation And The City Of Hollywood For Liquid Chlorine In One Ton Cylinders In An Estimated Annual Amount Of \$215,000.00

Staff Recommends: The Approval Of The Attached Resolution

Explanation:

The Department of Public Utilities requires the purchase of liquid chlorine as it is used in the disinfection of ocean outfall effluent and reuse effluent.

The required liquid chlorine was competitively bid by the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida who acted as the lead agency on behalf of the Southeast Florida Governmental Purchasing Cooperative Group which the City of Hollywood is a member.

The City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida's Bid Number 973-11915 was opened on May 11, 2017 and was awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder by line item, Allied Universal Corporation, on June 20, 2017, for a two (2) year agreement with the option to renew for two (2) additional one (1) year periods.

Allied Universal Corporation is currently providing these services to the City in a satisfactory manner.

The Director of Public Utilities and the Director of Procurement & Contract Compliance Officer recommend that the City Commission approve the issuance of the attached Blanket Purchase Order agreement for liquid chlorine to Allied Universal Corporation in an estimated annual amount of \$215,000.00.

Section 38.40 (C)(5) of the Purchasing Ordinance allows the Director to procure, without following formal procedures, all goods and services which are subject of contracts with the state, its political subdivisions, the United States government, other governmental entities, or a corporation not for profit whose members are governmental entities, public officers, or any combination thereof, provided however, the goods and services are: (i) the subject of a price schedule negotiated by the state or the United States government, or (ii) the subject of a contract with another governmental entity or a corporation not for profit whose members are governmental entities, public officers, or any combination thereof, which contract is based strictly on competitive bids or competitive proposals and not on any preference.

Award is subject to the City's receipt and approval of all insurance certificates required by the City's Risk Manager.

Funding has been provided in the fiscal year 2017 budget in the Public Utilities Department's Chemical Supplies Account Number 42.4041.00000.536.005233 and will be budgeted in subsequent fiscal years.
