### Explanation:

On September 18, 2013, the City Commission passed and adopted Resolution No. R-2013-263, which authorized the execution of the Regional Interlocal Agreement with Broward County Providing for Cooperative Participation in a Regional Public Safety Intranet ("Participation Agreement").

Broward County proposed amendments to the Participation Agreement which are needed to align the performance standards and engagement process with the Operator Agreement the County has with the Broward Sheriff's Office, to ensure compliance with Criminal Justice Information System or Florida Department of Law Enforcement Standards, and to permit

municipalities to procure special municipal services above the base level of services.
