

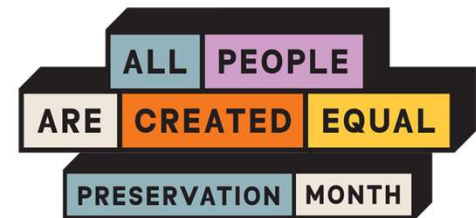

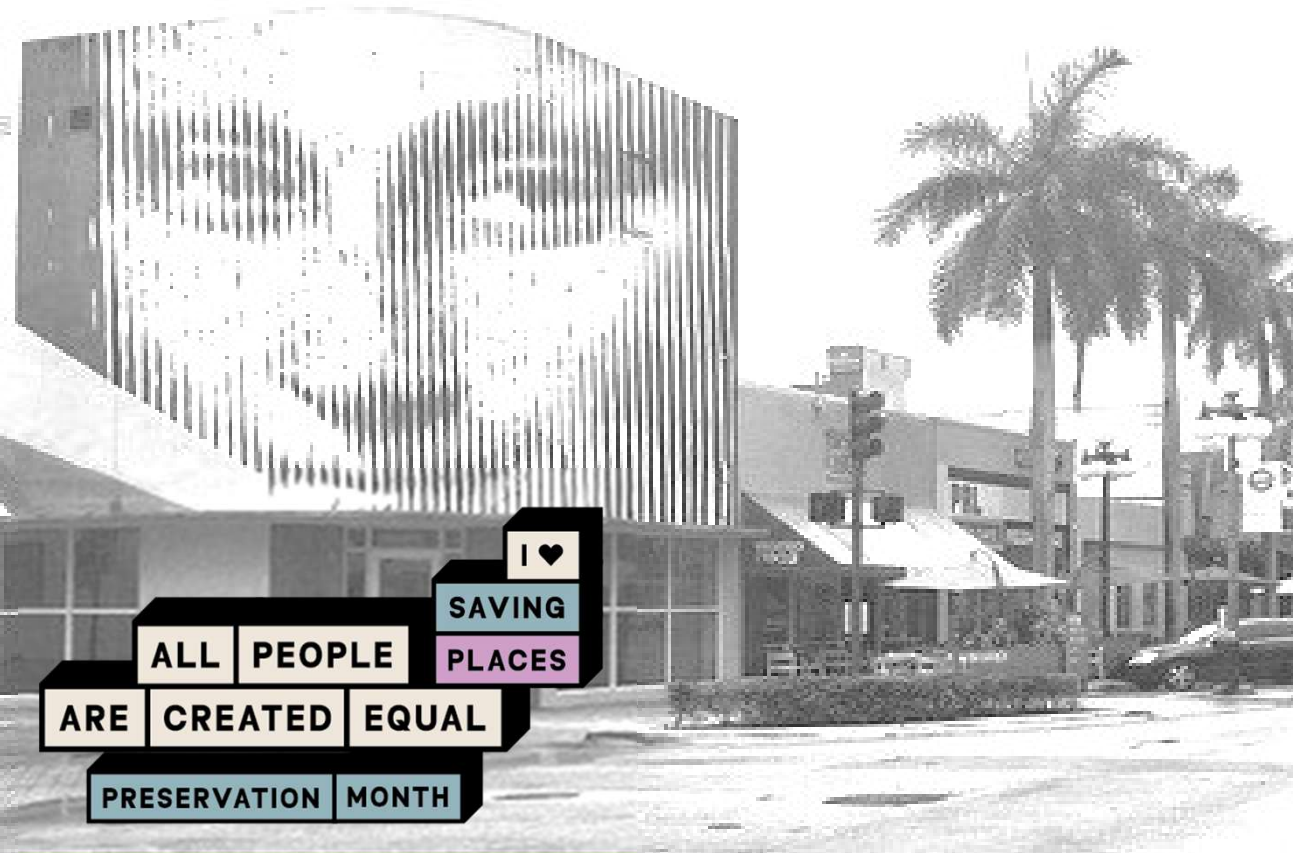

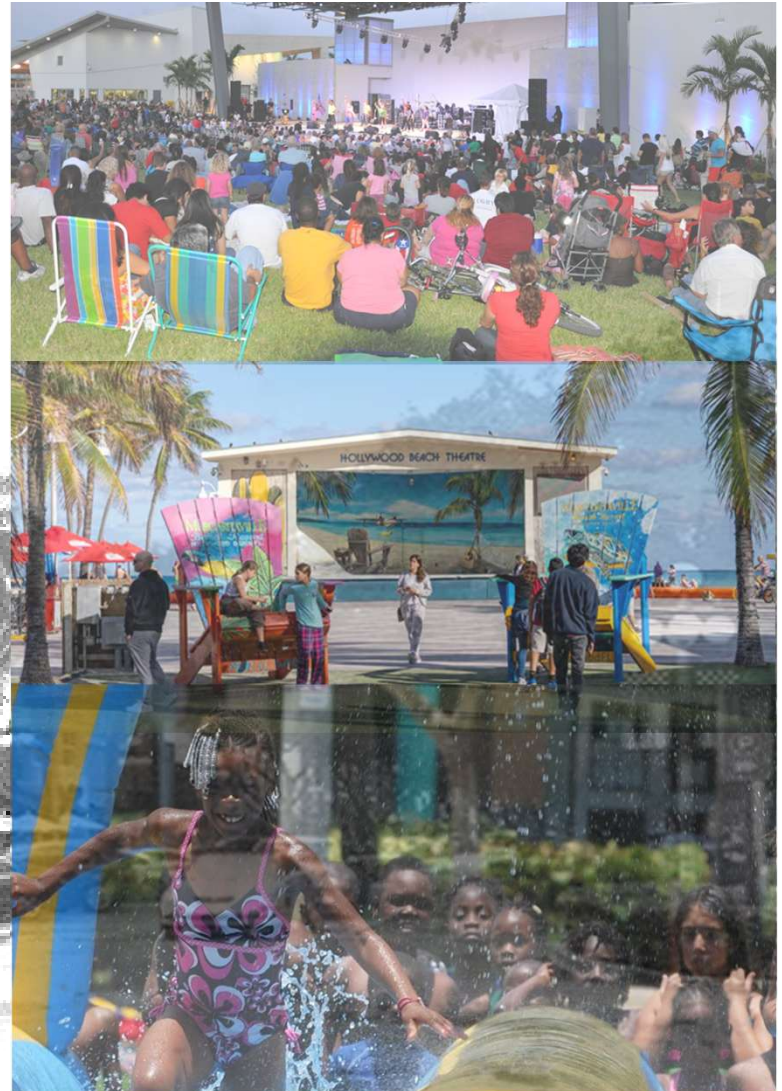

Adaptive Reuse Award Block 40 -Food Hall Downtown 1820 Hollywood Blvd

Overview:

- Mixed-use redevelopment integrating historic character with a modern high-rise residential tower in Downtown Hollywood.

Historical Significance:

- Incorporates Mediterranean Revival influences at the base—stucco façades, arched openings, and awnings—transitioning into a contemporary tower with balconies and glass, clearly distinguishing old and new.

Preservation Value:

- Maintains historic architectural character at the street level while allowing for modern urban growth and density.

Award for Rehabilitation Hollywood Art & Cultural Center - 1650 Harrison Street

Overview:

- Mediterranean Revival building (1935) with restored roof and modern addition.

Historical Significance:

- Contributing structure within the Lakes Historic District; long-standing cultural hub for the City.

Preservation Value:

- Restoration efforts have preserved the structure architectural integrity.





Award for Excellence in Community Engagement

City of Hollywood, Parks & Recreation & CMED 100-Year Celebration Event

Overview:

- A citywide centennial celebration marking 100 years of Hollywood, featuring multi-day events that brought together residents, businesses, and visitors.

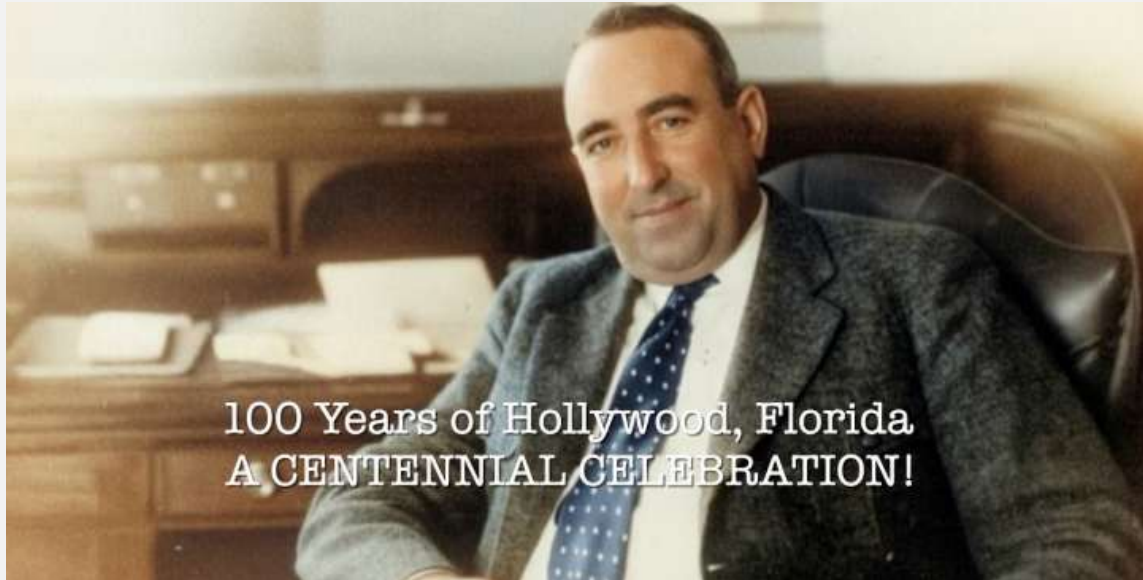
Historical Significance:

- Celebrates the City's founding in 1925 and highlights its growth, history, and community identity through cultural programming and public events.

Preservation Value:

- Promotes civic pride and historic awareness by engaging the community in shared heritage and commemorating a century of development and progress.





Special Recognition Award (Media / Film) Hollywood Historical Society and Steve Sarsfield

Movie: HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA A Centennial Celebration
100 Year Celebration movie on the history of Hollywood

Overview:

- Documentary film highlighting the history, evolution, and cultural identity of the City of Hollywood over the past 100 years.

Historical Significance:

- Captures and preserves key moments, stories, and milestones that shaped Hollywood, serving as a lasting visual record of the city's heritage.

Preservation Value:

- Serves as an educational and archival resource that promotes historic awareness and ensures the city's story is accessible for future generations.





Award for Rehabilitation (Residential): The front porch project - 1133 Van Buren Street

Overview:

- Residential rehabilitation project focused on restoring and enhancing the front porch as a key architectural feature.

Historical Significance:

- Reflects traditional neighborhood character, where front porches serve as defining elements of historic residential design and community interaction.

Preservation Value:

- Rehabilitation maintains the home's architectural integrity while reintroducing a compatible porch design that enhances both the structure and streetscape.





Award for Preservation

The English Tudor Condo buildings of Hollywood south beach strip (Built in early 1970's)

Overview:

- A collection of mid-rise residential condominium buildings constructed in the early 1970s along Hollywood Beach.

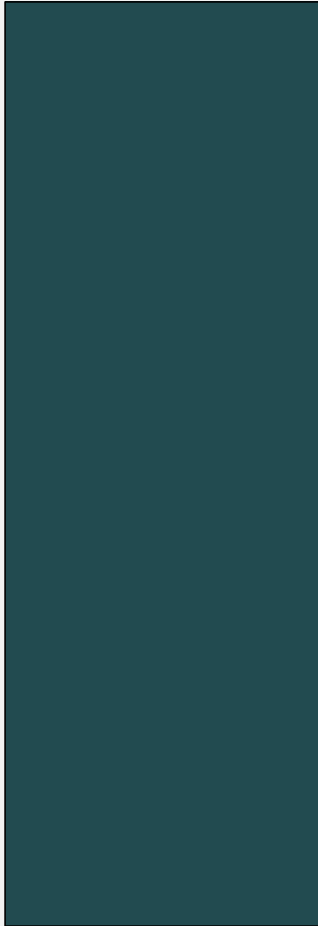
Historical Significance:

- These buildings represent the post-war coastal development era of Hollywood Beach, characterized by simple massing, flat roofs, and repetitive balconies. For example, Stratford Towers was completed around 1970–1971 and reflects the period's emphasis on oceanfront living and modern amenities

Preservation Value:

Identity of the Hollywood Beach skyline, preserving the scale and character of 1970s coastal residential design.





Hollywood Civic Contribution Award Robert Brian McCarthy (November 3, 1955 - February 19, 2026)

Overview:

- A long-time resident of Hollywood, Florida, whose life reflects the character and history of the local community.

Historical Significance:

- He was part of the fabric of South Florida's mid-to-late 20th century community life, representing a generation that contributed to the growth and identity of Hollywood as a coastal city. His life and legacy are tied to the broader evolution of the region during a period of significant population growth and cultural development

Preservation Value:

His story contributes to the collective memory and social history of Hollywood, helping to preserve the personal narratives that shape the identity and continuity of the community.



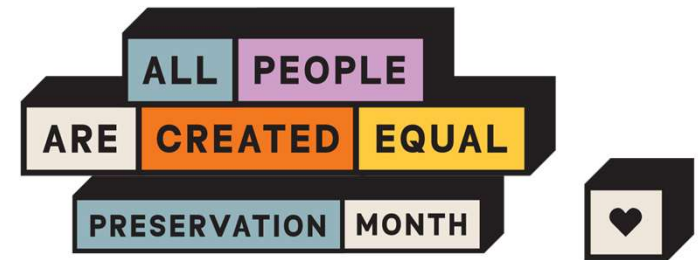

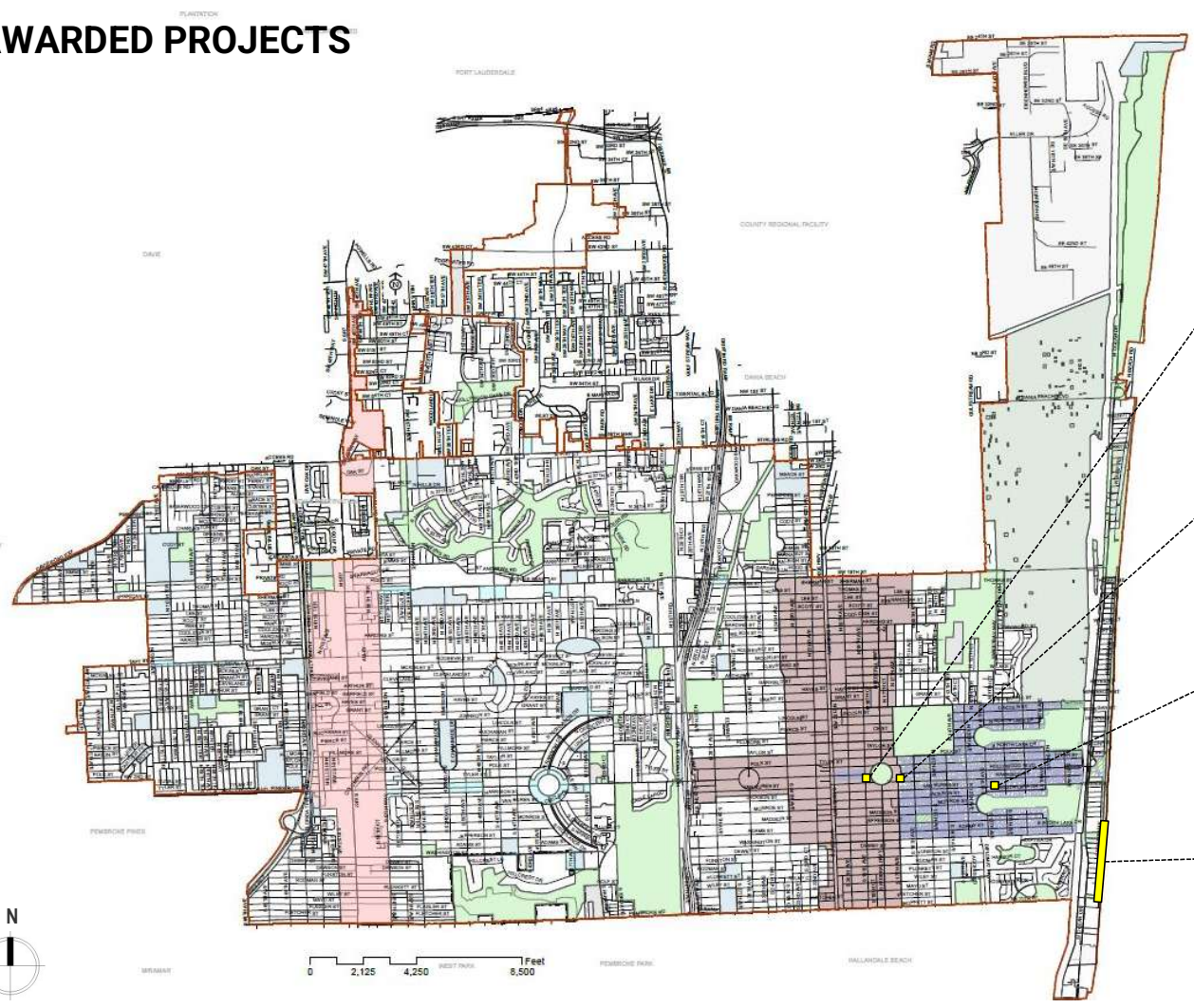
