Dunes

Mayor Levy requested support to bring back the Broward County Dune contract termination and redesign on the next agenda.

Extensive discussion ensued among staff and members of the Commission regarding Broward County Dune contract termination.

Commissioner Callari, Commissioner Gruber and Mayor Levy were in support of bringing the Dune item back.

Jose Cortes, Assistant City Manager, responded to questions raised by the Commission.

Raelin Storey, City Manager, stated there was immediate outreach to County staff regarding the project based on the post and rope going into critically narrowed areas over the weekend. She stated there has been communication over the course of the project, there have been several different issues brought forward with resolution for some of the issues.

Commissioner Callari left the meeting at 7:37 PM.

Extensive discussion ensued among staff and members of the Commission regarding Dunes on Hollywood Beach.

Raelin Storey, City Manager, stated the challenge is coming to an agreement on what adjustments can be made in the remainder of the project time frame.

Raelin Storey, City Manager, stated the County is out of compliance and there is a 10-day non-compliance notification period to cancel or terminate the contract for cause. She stated the City has sent a notice to stop work on Monday, April 13, 2026. She stated work has not ceased, but posts and other things have been removed.

Extensive discussion ensued among staff and members of the Commission.

Commissioner Callari returned to the meeting at 7:43 PM.

Christopher Roschek, Chief Resiliency Officer, explained the various issues regarding the location of the dunes, ropes and poles.

Mayor Levy stated the post and rope need to be removed immediately considering the 15-day timeline.
