A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO APPLY FOR FUNDING AND, IF AWARDED, ACCEPT FUNDING THROUGH THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION'S ROADS FOR ECONOMIC VITALITY ("REV") PROGRAM FOR A SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION INFILL PROJECT LOCATED WITHIN THE BOULEVARD HEIGHTS NEIGHBORHOOD, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000.00; COMMITTING THE APPLICABLE OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE COSTS UPON PROJECT COMPLETION; FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE ALL APPLICABLE GRANT APPLICATION DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS; ACKNOWLEDGING THAT THE PROJECT WILL BE DELIVERED AS A FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM ("LAP") PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization ("Broward MPO") approved the Roads for Economic Vitality Program ("REV") on July 9, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Boulevard Heights Neighborhood Sidewalk Infill Project located bounded by Taft Street to the north, Johnson Street to the south, the Florida Turnpike to the east, and N. 66th Avenue to the west ("Project") will be evaluated and ranked by the Broward MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with the REV program policies; and

WHEREAS, a resolution from the City Commission of the City of Hollywood ("City") Commission stating support for the Project is required to establish funding eligibility; and

WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the federally mandated Local Agency Program ("LAP") project process; and

WHEREAS, the City commits to administer and deliver the project under LAP; and

WHEREAS, the LAP project is reimbursement based as specified in the LAP agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City commits to funding upfront costs for design, Construction Engineering and Inspection (“CEI”) services, and construction to be then reimbursed as per the LAP agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City commits to program funding for construction contingency estimated at 10% of the Project costs per the requirements of LAP; and

WHEREAS, the Project will be constructed within the City’s rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City to operate and maintain the sidewalk improvements after the Project’s completion; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Development Services, Engineering, Transportation & Mobility Division desires to apply for this grant in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the required Project contingency and upfront costs will requested in the year required, which is anticipated to be FY 2035; and

WHEREAS, if the grant is awarded and accepted, the required upfront funds and contingency will be requested in a future Capital Improvement Plan subject to approval and adoption by the City Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HOLLYWOOD, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That the foregoing “WHEREAS” clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated in this Resolution.

Section 2: That it authorizes the appropriate City officials to pursue the Broward MPO’s 2026 REV funding of the Boulevard Heights Neighborhood Sidewalk Infill Project bounded by Taft Street to the north, Johnson Street to the south, the Florida Turnpike to the east, and N. 66th Avenue to the west in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000.00.

Section 3: That the City Manager is authorized to accept the funding, if awarded, provided that the City Manager shall have the discretion to refuse the funding in those circumstances where he/she determines it is in the best interest of the City to do so, in which case he/she shall advise the City Commission of her intention to refuse the funding.

Section 4: That upon the Broward MPO’s 2026 Roads for Economic Vitality funding being awarded to the City and the City Manager accepting the award; the City Manager is authorized to execute all agreements and other applicable documents in a form acceptable to the City Manager and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the City Attorney.

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Section 5: That it acknowledges that the project will be delivered as a Florida Department of Transportation Local Agency Program project.

Section 6: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
